## Farm Bureau News

Waco (Spl)-The Texas Farm Bureau has shown an increase in members for the 13th consecutive year, TFB Organization Director Wayne Little announced this week
Tabulations just completed place the membership figure at an alltime high of 95,229 . This represents a gain of 2,677 members over last year, Little said
"According to our best estimates," Little eaid, "this makes the Texas Farm Bureau about 24 times as large as the next largest general farm organization in the state The fact that the organization continues to grow in a period of declining farm population is evidence that most farmers and ranchers support the goals and philosophy of Farm Bureau"
Oct. 31, the end of the TFB's fiseal year, was deadline for the 200 organized counties in Texas to send in memberships to the state office in Waco. Final tabulation was slowed by the last minute influx of memberships, Little explained.
While final figures are not available from across the nation, the gain in Texas this year will place the TFB among the four or five largest atate Farm Bureaus in the nation, the organization director said.
The Texas Fartí Bureau has shown an increase of 29,918 members in the past ten years

## Cotton Report

Harvesting and ginning during the week on the Golden Spread continued in low gear, according to the USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service, Memphis Tex. During the latter part of the week, heavy dew has kept farmers out of fields early in the mornings. However, our sample receipts increased slightly each day. We are now receiving about 1500 samples per day, and with continued good weather, growers should be harvesting the early defoliated cotton nest week

K E Voelkel, officer in charge of the Memphis cotton classing office stated the sunny, warm days would give the late planted cotton an opportunity to mature before a hard freeze stops all growth. The hard freeze date for the immediate Memphis classing territory was Nov. 20 last season. Other dates were Nov. 18, 1963 Nov 8, 1962; Nov. 3, 1961; and Nov 10, 1960
For the week ending Friday, Nov. $5,6,000$ samples were classed This compared with 4,000 fon last week For the season 13,000 have been classed, whicb is the same as a year ago

A bunting license is required of every citizen of Texas who hunts outside the county of his residence or who hunts deer or turkey, except persons under 17 or over 65 years of age or persons hunting on the land on which they reside are not required to purchase this Ii cense, but must have an exempt license to hunt deer or turkey.
