register indicating his interest in selling or leasing cotton allotments. This information will be made available to anyone interested in this phase of the program and will remain on the counter as public information. Dec 31, 1965 is the last date a producer may file an application for transfer of a cotton allotment either by sale or lease. A Soil Bank farm will be eligible to sell or lease a cotton allotment but this will reduce the soil bank payment rate
