Program at School

Another Southern School Assemblies program will be given in the Hedley school on Tuesday, Jan. 11, at 3:00 p. m. A description of the program follows:

In the field of visual art, one of the most unique forms of expression is sand painting, European style, as demonstrated by Keith Parr. Handed down from Biblical times and practiced rather extensively by American Indians, sand painting still has a fascination for those interested in things creative. Certainly it is most unusual in its appeal to the eye.

Keith Parr is an accomplished artist in sand painting, and aided by a natural sense of showmanship, entertains his audiences in neat fashion. He stands behind a velvet covered easel and paints beautiful pictures with colored sand, even though they are upside down from his viewpoint.

His assistant, Jackie 'Leonardo de Vinci' Lester, complicates proceedings with both pertinent and impertinent remarks about the artist and his painting as it progresses, to lend a delightful variety to the program.

Through the medium of colored lighting effects and spotlights, the paintings actually seem to come to life. This effect is augmented by appropriate background music to harmonize with the picture.

Cotton Report

The Eastern Panhandle cotton harvest this week was again delayed by rain and cold according to the USDA Consumer and Marketing Service, Memphis, Texas.

Sample receipts declined as a result of the adverse weather, and grades and micronaire readings also reflected lower quality. K. E. Voelkel, in charge of the Memphis cotton classing office stated that 17,000 samples were classed during the week ending Friday, Dec. 31, bringing the seasonal total to 127,000. This compared with 118,000 last season and 219,000 as of the same date in 1961. It is estimated that about 65 percent of the expected production has been classed in this 12 county area.

Reapportioned Cotton Acreage

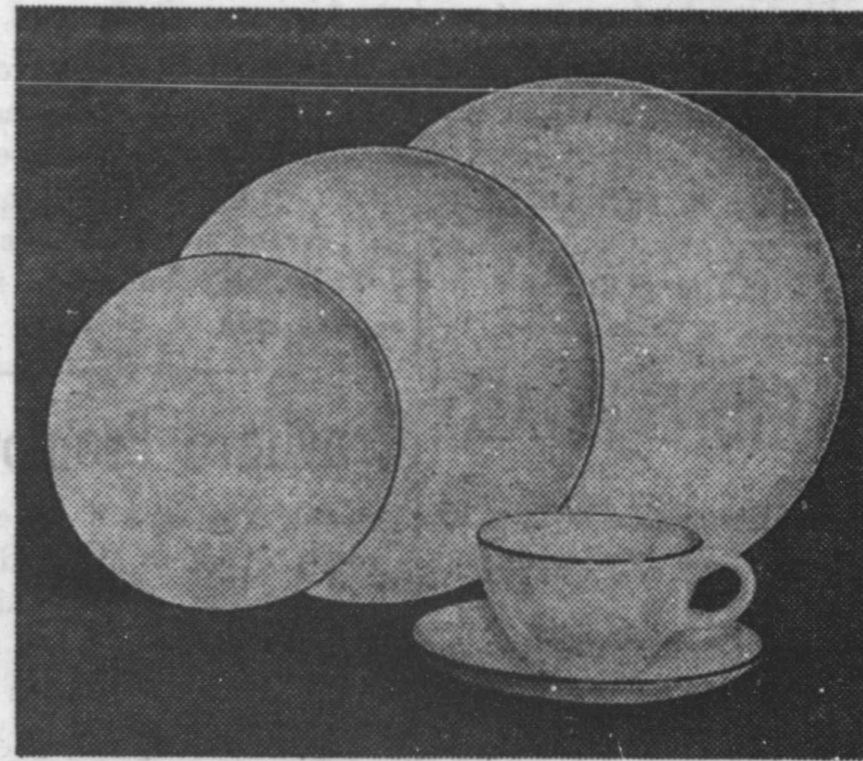

Boat Owners Warned

Austin, Texas—More than 200 thousand motorboats subject to the new Texas Water Safety Act must be registered by April 1, State Highway Engineer D. C. Greer said today.

The law gives the Motor Vehicle Division of the Texas Highway Department the task of issuing certificates of number for boats operating in Texas waters, just as the division administers issuing of licenses and titles to motor vehicles operating on Texas highways

Renewal notices for boats now registered in Texas will go out starting Jan 3, along with a brochure outlining key features of the new act

"This is a good time for Texas skippers to brush up on the law," Greer said, "to make certain their craft complies with the extensive changes in the new Water Safety Act"

For the first time, state game wardens have full authority to enforce water safety statutes

All current certificates of number for motorboats operating in Texas waters expire March 31, Greer said
