Time Running Out On Giant \$1.75 Bargain

The following was swiped from the Zavala County Sentinel:

A highly prized, under advertised bargain is selling locally to a select group of Donley County residents for a limited time only! This red hot special is available free of charge to an even more select few.

Only those persons who are American citizens and have lived in Texas for the past year and Donley County for the past six months are eligible to own this remarkable bargain, which can be purchased from now through Jan 31 at the Donley County courthouse. This offer will definitely not be extended.

This valuable item is a 1966 poll tax receipt which entitles the purchaser to a voice in local government through a variety of local elections through January of 1967.

This poll tax receipt, limited to one per qualified person, is good for one vote for school board members, city officials, a county judge, county clerk and county treasurer, commissioners in two precincts, and a vote in any possible special election during the year.

Those eligible for free poll tax receipts include persons reaching voting age for the first time and persons over 60 whose birthday occurred on or before Jan. 1, 1966, who are exempt from paying and are still eligible to vote.

This giant package deal, though low in price, is something which no eligible local resident can afford to do without.

Weather Hazardous

Area farmers were glad to see the heavy snow here during the past week, although driving conditions have been very hazardous and there have been numerous collisions, most of them minor.

Cotton Report

Cotton harvesting came to an abrupt halt as snow and ice blanketed the Eastern Panhandle on Tuesday and Thursday nights according to the USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service, Memphis, Texas.

K. E. Voelkel, in charge of the Memphis classing office, stated that 21,000 samples were classed during the week ending Friday, Jan. 21. This brought the seasonal total to 198,000, which is 31,000 samples more than for the 1964-65 season.

The grades of cotton classed this week were lower in quality than those of a week ago. White grades decreased to 17 percent from 18 percent the week earlier; Light Spotted grades amounted to 59 percent compared with 67 percent; Spotted grades represented 22 percent compared with 14 percent last week; and 2 percent classed Tinged as compared with 1 percent the previous week.

Medicare Program

People 65 or over need to be reminded they do not have much longer to enroll in the Medicare program under social security, according to Hal Geldon, Manager of the Amarillo Social Security office.

The enrollment period began September 1, 1965, and will end March 31, 1966. Persons who were 65 or older in 1965, must sign up during this enrollment period if they want the supplemental medical insurance.

People who are receiving social security or railroad retirement benefits have received their enrollment card by mail. Persons receiving old age assistance benefits from the Texas Department of Public Welfare will be contacted by their welfare office. Others who have not signed up for either of these benefits should contact their Amarillo social security office now for assistance in enrolling.

Skip-Row Planting

Percentages of cotton planted in a skip-row planting pattern will be determined as follows:

- 2 rows cotton, 1 row out, 86 2/3% cotton
- 2 rows cotton, 2 rows out, 65% cotton
- 4 rows cotton, 4 rows out, 50% cotton
- 2 rows cotton, 4 rows out, 33 1/3% cotton

Only four normal rows will qualify for diverted acres under the annual programs.
