He was born Sept. 1, 1911 at Saint Jo. He served in the Army Signal Corps in World War II and was married to Hazel Kay Stewart of Hedley in Nocona in September, 1939.

Survivors include his wife; a sister, Mrs. Lucile Franklin of Hedley; and a niece and nephew.

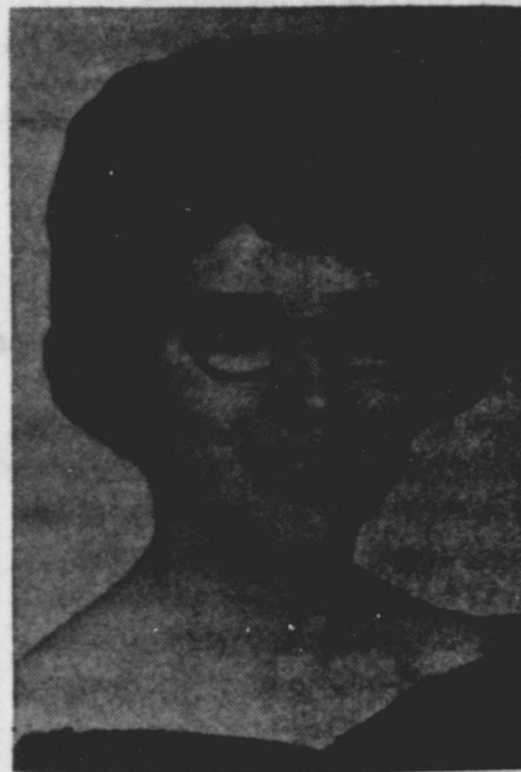

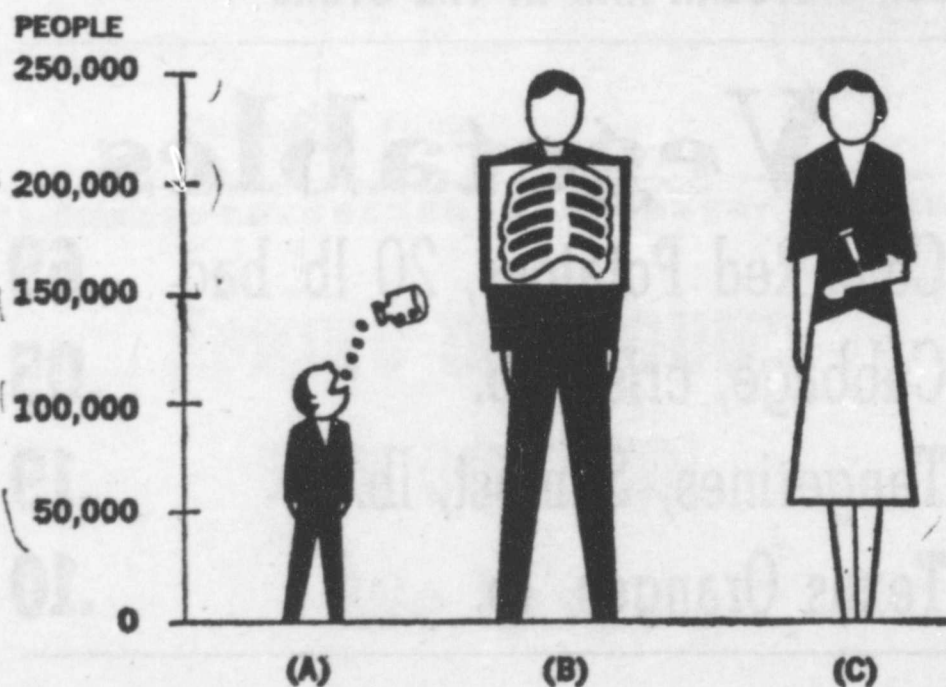

610,000 Americans are directly threatened by TB —110,000 of them because they have known active disease



(A) They need treatment or (B) careful checkups by chest X-ray or (C) tuberculin skin test.

- (A) 110,000 are known to have active tuberculosis.
- (B) 250,000 have had TB recently and might relapse.
- (C) 250,000 live closely with people with newly discovered active disease.

These 610,000 are known to be involved with tuberculosis. Others are unknown. The fight to find, treat and help all TB-involved Americans must go on, in order to achieve control and eventual eradication of the disease in this country. Your Christmas Seal contribution helps in that fight.

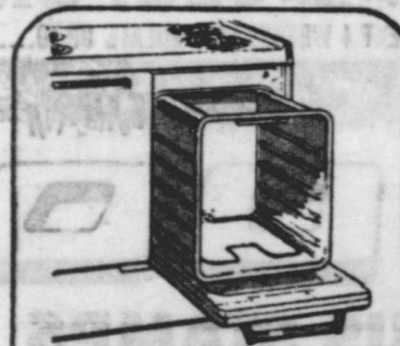

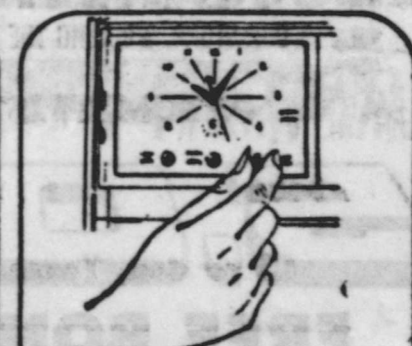
