Measurement Service (After the Crops are Planted)

\$7 00 per farm plus \$2 00 for each plot over one plus \$2.50 for mileage and office work.

We will help you every way we can in the office to determine your acreage, but please remember that you are the one certifying to the acreage reported We will be required to spot check at random 25% of the farms reporting mea-


