Lt. Comdr. Millard L. Word, 32, passed away recently at Misawa, Japan, due to a blood clot as a result of a fall on some ice in Misawa some days ago. Funeral services are pending until the body arrives in the United States.

Mr. Word was a native of Amarillo and had been a test pilot for the U S Navy about ten years. He graduated from Clarendon High School and attended Clarendon Junior College. He graduated from West Texas State University before enlisting in the Navy. He had flown many combat missions over Viet Nam and had won two Distinguished Flying Crosses and several Air Medals with Oak Leaf clusters during his military career.

He is survived by his wife, Jan; three sons David, Michael and Timothy; and a daughter, Kimberly; all of Misawa; also his mother, Mrs. Millard R. Word of Amarillo; a brother, Bob Word of Clarendon; and a sister, Mrs. Bill Mathers of Miles City, Mont.

He was a nephew of Mrs. Dennis Reed of Hedley.

Girl Scout Week

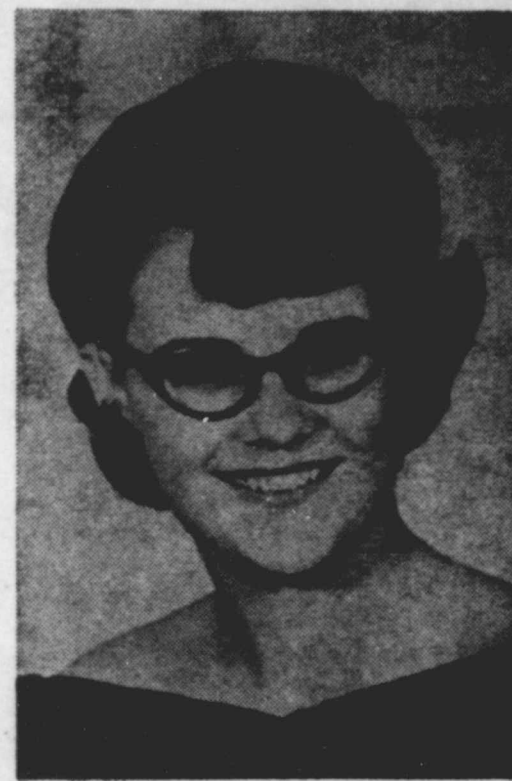
Don't forget the Junior Girl Scouts are selling cookies this week to help their troop buy materials for handwork.

Voter Registration

Attorney General Waggoner Carr advises that all persons who were subject to paying poll tax during the period which ended on January 31, 1966, in order to be qualified to vote in the 1966 elections, but who did not pay a poll tax or obtain a "poll tax not paid" for voting in federal elections, should now register. The registration period began March 3 and ends March 17. This must be done at the tax office in the county courthouse.

Persons who already have a poll tax receipt, a receipt stamped "poll tax not paid" (for voting in federal elections) or those who have received an exemption certificate should not register.

1966 Crop Measurements

All producers except those who have soil bank will be required to measure their own farms this year. This method of measurement was used in several counties around us last year and proved very satisfactory. Many dollars were saved in the counties which used this type of performance.

A measurement service will be offered if a producer prefers to pay the cost of having a county office representative do the measuring for him. The charges are as follows:

Pre-measurement Service (Before the Crops are Planted)

\$14.00 per farm plus \$2.00 for each plot over one plus 15¢ per estimated acre and plus \$5.00 for mileage and office work.

Measurement Service (After the Crops are Planted)

\$7.00 per farm plus \$2.00 for each plot over one plus \$2.50 for mileage and office work.

We will help you every way we can in the office to determine your acreage but please remember that you are the one certifying to the acreage reported. We will be required to spot check at random 25% of the farms reporting measurements.

1966 Program Signup

You are reminded that April 1, 1966 is the final date to sign your Intent on to Participate in the wheat, feed grain, and cotton pro-

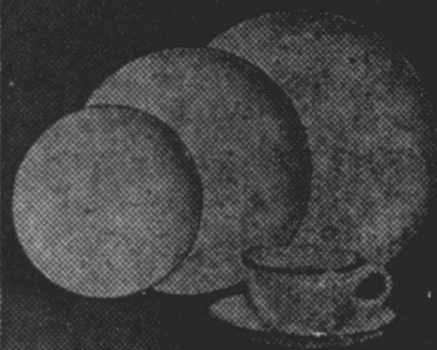
grams. These are all volunteer programs. Find out if they suit your farming operations; if so, be sure and sign up before the deadline.

You are reminded that all producers regardless of the size of the allotment, who intend to earn cotton payments, must sign an Intention to Participate prior to April 1.

Have you carried out an ACP practice on your farm or ranch in the last five years? If you have not, then we are especially interested in you. There are more than 50% of the farms and ranches in Donley County that are not carrying out any kind of a conservation program and thus are slowly but surely deteriorating.

This year, for the first time, you may earn cost share assistance at the rate of 80% of the cost of carrying out any of the ACP practices if your gross family income is \$3,000 or less.

Sign Up

Let us remind you April 1 is the final date for signing an Intention to Participate in the 1966 Feed Grain, Wheat and Cotton Programs. Remember also, there is no automatic participation; you must sign up to be eligible for price support payments, diverted acres payments, or price support loans.
