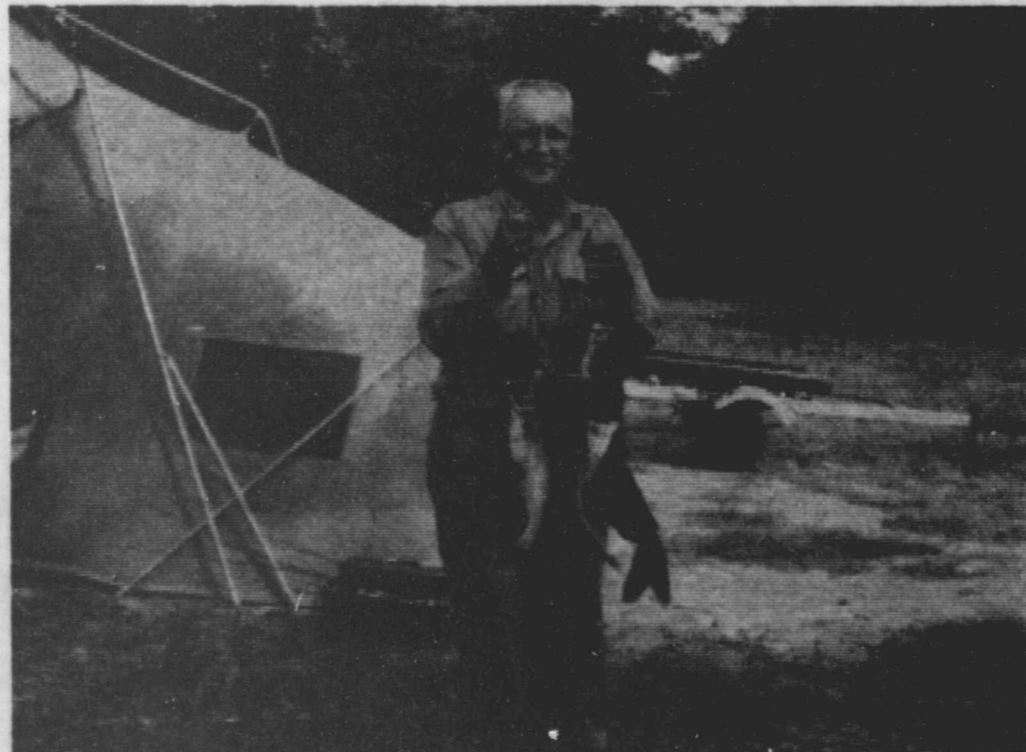

Cotton Production Records

All cotton farmers in Donley County are being asked to furnish this office with their cotton production records of any cotton ginned outside this county in 1963, 1964 and—or 1965. We have the records from all the gins in Donley County for these years

These records will be considered by the ASC Committee in setting the 1967 cotton yields.

If you ginned cotton in any other county in any one or all of these 3 years, please bring these gin records in at your earliest convenience

Diverted Acres

Some concern is being given as to the eligibility of some of the acreage being designated as diverted under the various farm programs. Listed below are some of the major requirements for the designated diverted acres:

- 1 Must be equal in productivity to other land on the farm
- 2 Must not be grazed between May 1 and November 1.
- 3 Must have been intensely cultivated or under CR contract during one of the last four years
- 4 Crops cannot be harvested from the acreage during the year.
5. Must be reasonable in shape.
6. Must be controlled from weeds and erosion.

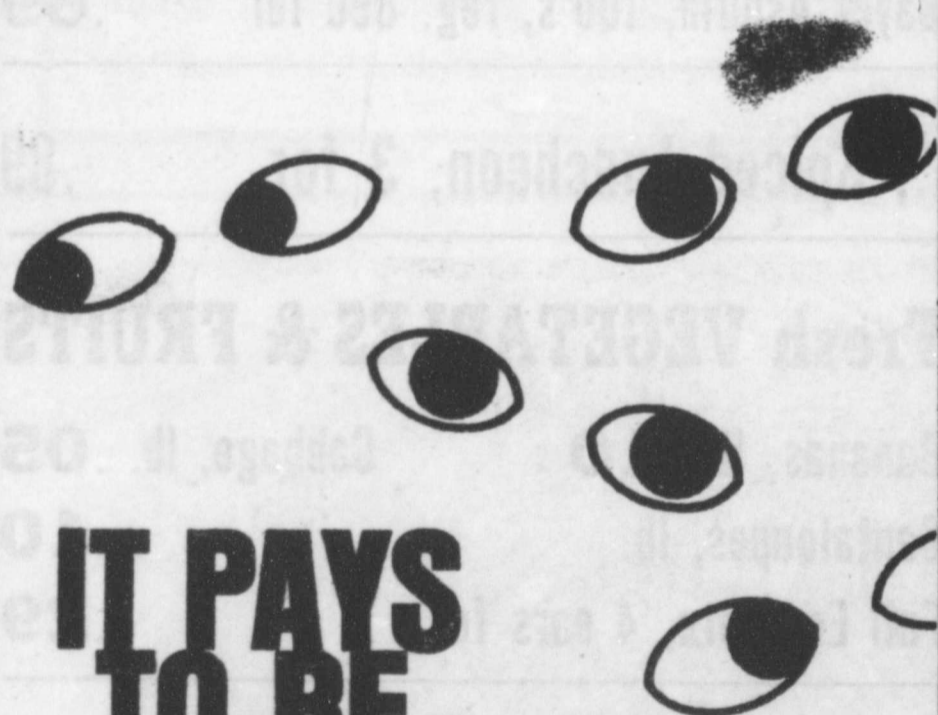
