New Method For Long Distance Calls

A new and improved method of placing long distance calls is being recommended by General Telephone Company of the Southwest for customers served from the company's Memphis long distance center.

The new method which requires the use of the area code also eliminates the need for giving the name of the town being called, according to Wayne Goodrum, Manager of General's Memphis District

"The best way to place a long distance call," Goodrum said, "is to give the operator the information in five steps. First, the Area Code of the place being called; next the number you are calling; the person you are calling (but only if you are calling person-to-person); then wait until the operator asks for your number. Your name will not be needed unless the operator asks for it."

"With the new procedure the operator enters all the necessary information on an IBM card instead of the more familiar tickets. All handling is purely automatic operation once the card passes from the operator's hand," Goodrum explained. "IBM computers, located at San Angelo, do all the rating of the calls automatically, eliminating possibilities of human errors"

"Beginning with the October bills details of most long distance calls will be printed directly on the customer's bill and will include the "from" and "to" points, called number, minutes talked and amount of call. A code will be used to indicate the type call and the rate class. This code is explained on the back of the bill"

General's Memphis long distance center serves as the "Master" office for 10 area communities. The exchanges are Clarendon, Dodson, Estelline, Flomot, Hedley, Lakeview, Memphis, Quitaque, Turkey and Wellington

Veterans Can Now Apply For Ed. Benefits

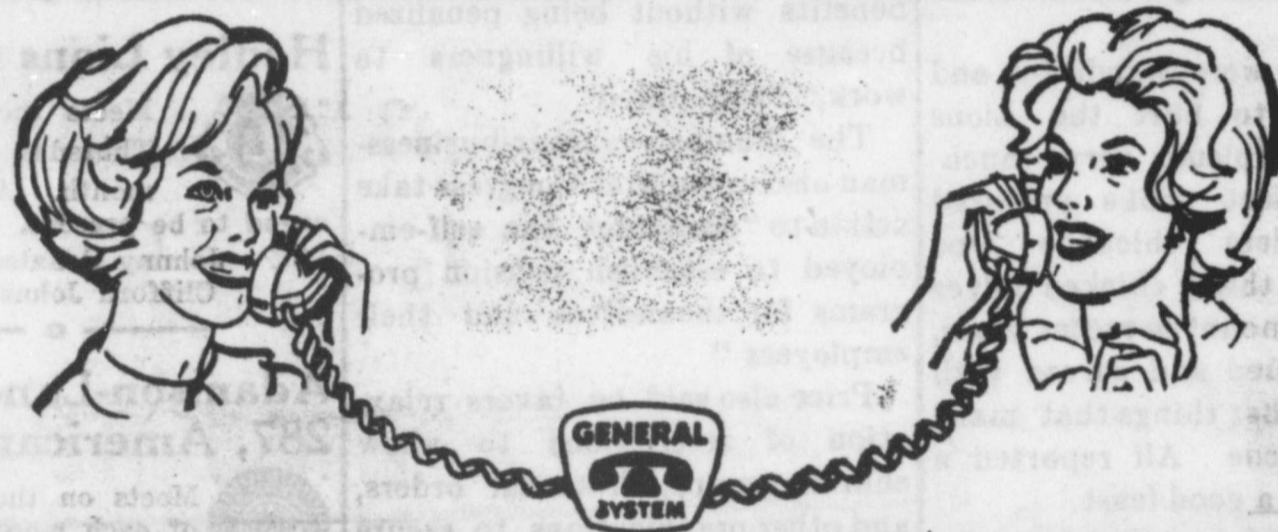
Approximately 28,000 veterans in the Waco Veterans Administration Regional Office area are expected to apply for educational benefits under PL 89-358 during the first year, according to Jack Coker, Manager of the Waco Regional Office.

The first payments have been issued to veterans enrolled in summer school and these payments were for attendance during the month of June. Payments may be made only after the VA receives a certificate of attendance submitted by the veteran at the end of each month he is in attendance.

Coker cautioned that students reporting for school this fall should have sufficient funds in addition to enrollment costs to support themselves for at least two months, since it takes approximately that long before the first VA check may be issued. Students should be prepared also to supplement educational allowance payments, as normally these payments will not be sufficient to cover all of their educational expenses.

Veterans applying for benefits will receive a certificate of eligibility showing the school and the training objectives they have selected. These are presented to the school, which in turn will certify veterans' enrollments. Coker urged that veterans be sure that they meet entrance requirements and that they will be accepted by their chosen school before filing an application for educational benefits.

Give the operator this information and in this order -

1. Area code

2. Called number

3. Called party (if person to person)

4. Then wait until the Operator asks, and give her all seven digits of your telephone number

These suggestions speed up your calls because operators are now using a new form of ticket. These "Mark Sense" tickets permit machine interpretation of long distance records, to insure correct billing. Please note: It's no longer necessary to give the operator the name of the town you are calling.

Gasoline Tax Refund

Farmers and ranchers will not file a claim for refund of Federal tax on gasoline used on their farm or ranch as they have done in past years according to Ronald Gooch County Agent. Instead, the refund of Federal tax on gasoline used on or after July 1, 1965, must be claimed as a credit on their annual income tax return.

This credit will first be taken on the return for the first full tax year beginning after June 30, 1965. If the return is filed on a calendar year basis, the credit for gasoline tax refund taken on their 1966 return will include the tax on gasoline used in the period from July 1, 1965 through December 31, 1966.

The refund is claimed as a credit in a manner similar to the credit for tax withheld on wages, Gooch said.

Price Visits Here

The problem of inflation which hurts everyone, is even more heartbreaking because of the great hardship it causes America's senior citizens, congressional candidate Bob Price said Monday.

"If elected, I will use every means at my command to stop the deficit spending which lays the foundation for inflation and the resulting decrease in disposable income for those on pensions or other fixed incomes," Price told audiences in Clarendon and Hedley.

The 18th District candidate also recommended that the ceiling on the amount of money a Social Security recipient can earn and still be eligible for benefits be abolished.

"A worker who has contributed to Social Security during his most productive years is entitled to his benefits without being penalized because of his willingness to work," Price stated.

The Pampa rancher-businessman also urged that Congress take action to "encourage the self-employed to establish pension programs for themselves and their employees."

Price also said he favors relaxation of restrictions to allow church groups, fraternal orders, and other organizations to secure non-subsidized Federal Housing Administration loans for the construction of homes for senior citizens.

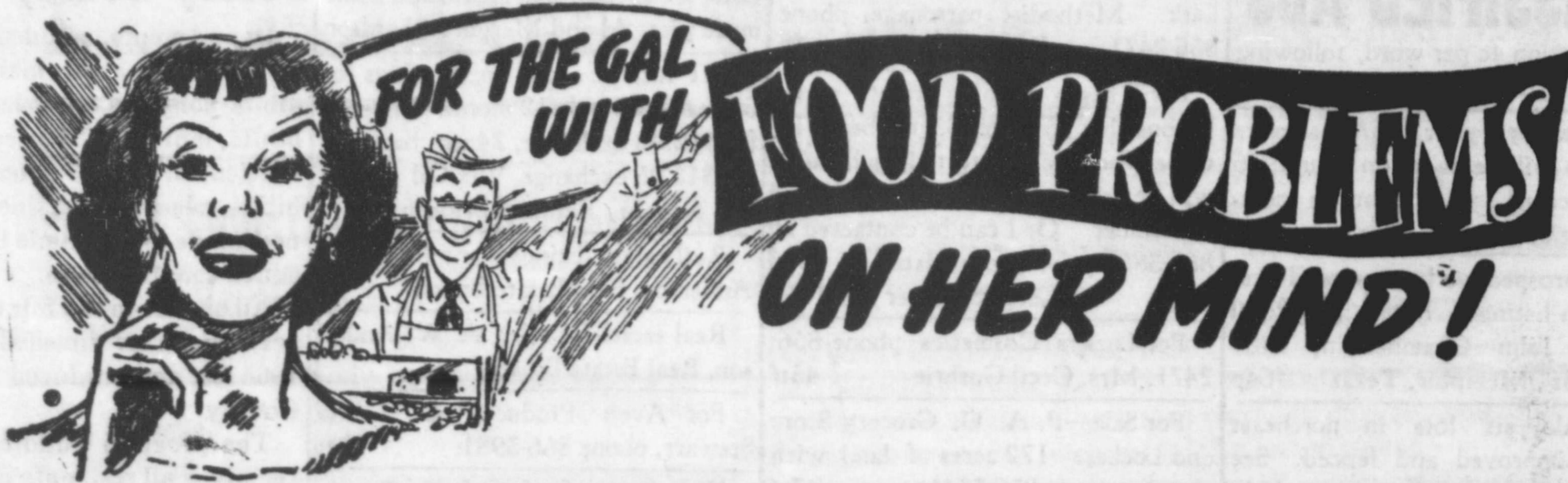
