Two Die In Crash

Two persons were killed and another injured Monday afternoon in a double collision just east of Hedley on Highway 287.

A truck driven by Alford Cather, 29, of Fort Worth, first collided with a car driven by Mrs. Addie Bernard, 62, of Quanah, who was reported in fair condition Monday night in a Memphis hospital, then the truck collided with a car occupied by Carroll Oklen Moyer, 50, and his wife, Margaret V. Moyer, 47, of McAllen, both of whom were killed instantly in the crash.

The truck caught fire following the crash and the fuel tanks exploded, the cab being completely destroyed by the explosion and fire. The fire was extinguished by the Hedley Fire Dept.

Donley County is compiling a very discouraging record of deaths on its highways this year. It is to be hoped that when Highway 287 becomes a four lane road through the county some of these ghastly crashes can be eliminated.

News From Our County Agent

The elm leaf beetle is doing a lot of damage to elm trees throughout Donley County, according to County Agent Ronald Gooch. The elm leaf beetle is one of the most destructive pests of the elm tree. This yellowish-green 1/2 inch long beetle or the small yellow to black larvae can be found skeletonizing the leaves or crawling about on the bark of the trunk of infested elm trees.

This beetle can be controlled by thoroughly spraying the trees with one of the following insecticides; sevin, DDT, toxaphene or chlordane. Another application may be necessary for the second generation of the beetle, using this application several days after the first one. The addition of 1/2 teaspoonful of linseed oil per gallon of spray will help the spray stick to the leaves of the tree.

Gooch stressed that caution should be used in the use of these and any other insecticide.

Vehicle Inspection

Austin—Colonel Homer Garrison Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety has announced that the 1967 vehicle inspection period has begun.

He said that the new inspection period began on Sept 1 and will end on April 15, 1967. The inspection period is the same as in previous years.

"This means that between now and April 15 1967, each of the five and one half million Texas registered vehicles will have to secure the new green and white 1967 inspection sticker from one of the 5500 official inspection stations," he said.

Garrison pointed out that Texas inspection stations can be identified by the official vehicle inspection station sign displayed at each station.

Gasoline Tax Refund

Farmers and ranchers will not file a claim for refund of Federal tax on gasoline used on their farm or ranch as they have done in past years according to Ronald Gooch County Agent. Instead, the refund of Federal tax on gasoline used on or after July 1, 1965, must be claimed as a credit on their annual income tax return.


This credit will first be taken on the return for the first full tax year beginning after June 30, 1965. If the return is filed on a calendar year basis, the credit for gasoline tax refund taken on their 1966 return will include the tax on gasoline used in the period from July 1, 1965 through December 31, 1966.

The refund is claimed as a credit in a manner similar to the credit for tax withheld on wages, Gooch said.
