## Overseas Mail

Postmaster Davis of Hedley today announced that henceforth all first class mail, personal sound recordings (voice letters), and parcels weighing 5 pounds or less and measuring not more than 60 inches in length and girth combined, will be airlifted on a space available basis between the United States and all military post offices overseas.

Also second class publications such as newspapers and magazines published weekly or more often, and featuring current news of interest to the military, will be airlifted from San Francisco to the armed forces serving in Viet Nam.

The parcels described above will be moved by surface transportation within the United States from the points of mailing to the port of embarkation, and to speed up separation and delivery of parcels within this category, they will be clearly marked upon acceptance at the Post Office with the letters SAM (Surface Airlift Mail), to eliminate reweighing and measuring the parcels at San Francisco.

Postmaster Davis also reminded mailers that Christmas parcels weighing 5 pounds and under, though they are given airlift priority from San Francisco to Viet Nam on a space available basis, should be mailed no later than December 1.

Fontenot flew home from Cam Ranh Bay, Viet Nam, to attend his stepson's funeral.

Mr. Lund is also survived by his father, John Lund of Chehalis, Wash.

## Accident Report

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 5 accidents on rural highways in Donley County during the month of October, according to Sergeant J. W. Wilson, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in two persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$3,810.00.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first ten months of 1966, shows a total of 59 accidents resulting in 9 persons killed, 32 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$45,145.00.

## Cotton Report

Although the bulk of the cotton is open and a hard freeze 10 days ago, which came 3 weeks earlier than last year, killed the plant completely, the Eastern Panhandle harvest continued at a slow pace, according to the USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service in Memphis, Texas. The freeze damaged late planted cotton and the top crop in many fields.

K. E. Voelkel, in charge of the Cotton Division's Memphis classing office stated that the lateness in harvesting was reflected in the 5500 samples classed through Nov. 10, as compared with 16,000 samples classed as of the same date last year.

Cotton Allotment Transfers

The Upland Cotton Program for 1967 provides that cotton allotments may be sold or leased for transfer to another farm within the county or may be transferred by a farm owner to another farm owned by him in any other county Donley County producers disapproved the transfer of cotton by sale or lease outside the county. Farmers in Donley County can transfer cotton acreage under the following conditions:

1. Transfer by sale or lease from one farm to another within Donley County
2. Transfer by sale or lease from farms in other counties to farms in Donley County
3. Transfer by a farm owner to another farm owned or controlled by him within the State.

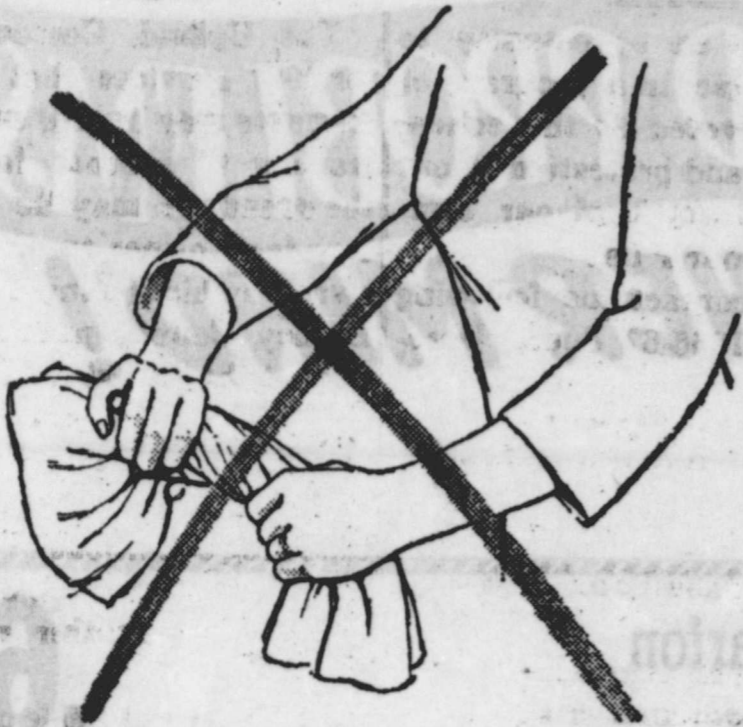

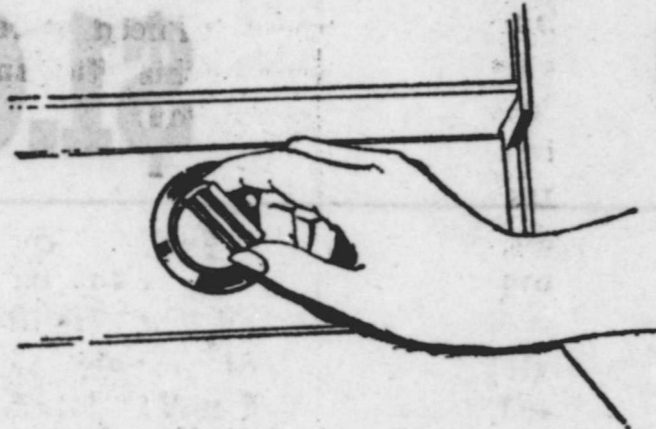
