1967 Cotton, Feed Grain and Wheat Signup

Sign-up for the 1967 cotton, feed grain wheat programs will begin Feb 6, 1967, and continue through March 3 This means that sign-up period will last only four weeks Notices of yield, payment rates, bases, allotments, and conserving bases will be mailed to you in January.

Cotton Transfers

Applications will be accepted through Jan 3, 1967 to sell or lease 1967 cotton acreage.

New Growers Cotton Allotment

Jan. 17, 1967 is the final date for applying for a 'new Grower's' cotton allotment. Neither the operator nor the owner of the farm covered by the application can own or operate any other farm in the United States for which a cotton allotment is established for the current year Land must be suitable for production of cotton, and the operator must expect more than 50% of his income from agricultural commodities excluding cotton production from the farm

Cotton Report

With harvesting fast coming to a close, Golden Spread cotton classed during the week continued to reflect lower quality, reported USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service in Memphis, Texas.

For the week ending Wednesday, Dec 21, 14,500 samples were classed for a seasonal total of 103,000 Last season as of the same date, 102 000 samples had been classed. The big difference in the two seasons is that last year at this time we had classed slightly over 50 percent of total classed for the season compared with \$4 percent classed to date of the expected 1966 crop




