First Baptist Church

Last Wednesday evening the First Baptist Church voted by an overwhelming majority to build a new educational building. The vote in the regular monthly business meeting was 30 for and 2 abstentions. There were no opposing votes cast.

Construction of the \$9,500 educational unit will begin the first part of February. The building will extend 50 feet southward from the existing educational building. The exterior of the building will have a brick front to match the auditorium, and the remainder will be stucco.

The proposed plan calls for departmental and class room space for Juniors, Intermediates, and Young People. The interior will be of mahogany paneling throughout with tile floor and acoustical tile ceilings.

Anyone wishing to contribute to the Building Fund may see C. R. Hunsucker, Vergil McPherson, or the pastor, C. H. Murphy Jr.

The pastor stated that, "this decision to build will not only enable the First Baptist Church to improve its ministry and outreach in Hedley, but it will unify our membership in its task of winning the lost and helping Christians grow into the kind of person God would have them to be."

Register To Vote!

Voters of this area are reminded that the deadline for registering to vote this year is Tuesday Jan 31. Persons between 21 and 60 years old who do not register by the deadline will not be able to vote in 1967.

The poll tax is no longer required for voting, but everyone between the ages of 21 and 60 who plans to vote must register to be eligible. Registration is not required for persons aged 60 or over who live in a city of less than 10,000 population. There is no charge for registration. Registration may be made by a qualified voter only for himself, spouse, mother, father, son or daughter.

A representative of the sheriff's office will be in Hedley at the City Hall on Saturday, Jan. 28, from 10 a. m. to 4 p. m., in order to assist residents of Hedley and surrounding area to register. Or those wishing to register before that date may do so at the courthouse in Clarendon.

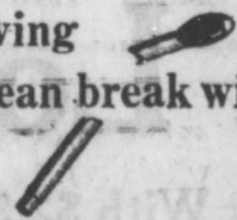

Austin—Col Homer Garrison, Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, has reminded Texas motorists that most vehicles have not yet been inspected for their 1967 vehicle inspection sticker.

"The inspection period is two-thirds over and only about one-

third of the vehicles have been inspected," said Garrison. "This means that during the weeks remaining before the April 15 deadline for inspections, more than twice as many persons each week must have their car inspected to avoid long lines forming at the end of the period."
