Greenbelt Dam

Clifford Johnson, local director, attended the regular board of directors meeting of the Greenbelt Water Authority at Childress Thursday night. The dam was reported 87% complete.

A small lake of nearly 1000 acre feet is now backed up behind the dam. They are still letting something over one million gallons of water a day go down stream. This will be cut off in the next week and the lake should be large enough to start stocking with fish soon.

Work on the filter plant hasn't fared well in the last month. Bad weather for outside work and a shortage of help has slowed down construction. It is less than 50% complete. The pipe line from Quanah to Crowell is progressing according to schedule.

Vehicle Registration

Austin—The Texas Highway Department reported today that more than 67 million motor vehicles will be registered in Texas in 1967 and urged car owners to

buy their license plates early.

The new license plates may be purchased during February and March at county tax assessor-collector's offices or at authorized sub-stations. New license plates must be displayed after midnight April 1.

A Highway Department spokesman said motorists can help shorten waiting lines and speed up registration by buying license plates early and by presenting proper ownership documents.

Car owners are required by law to present certificates of title and last year's license plate receipts when renewing vehicle registrations.

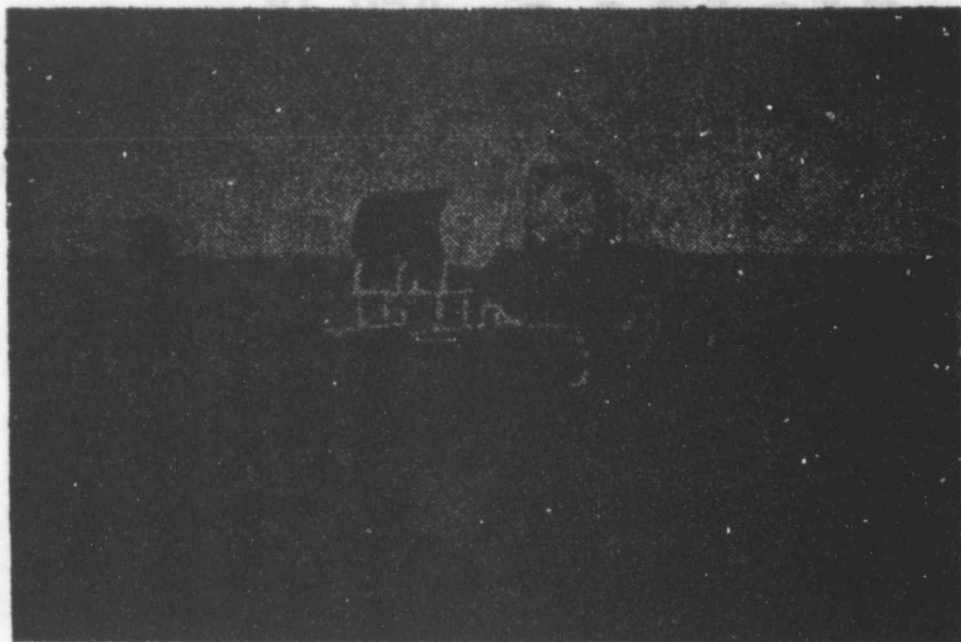
