





The signup date for the 1967 cotton feed grain and wheat an nual programs has been extended until March 17. The final date to release extra cotton or to request extra cotton is still March 3.

Measurement Services

The measurement service for wheat is available. The staking service for cotton, feed grain, and diverted acreages is also available. Charges for these services will vary for the individual farms, so if you're interested, come in and talk with us
