## Phalen Weatherly

Funeral services for Carroll Phalen Weatherly, 39, of Winston-Salem, N. Car., who passed away there Friday, Feb. 17, were held in Voglers Chapel there at 2 p. m. on Monday, Feb. 20. Burial was in a Winston-Salem cemetery.

Phalen was born in Estelline in 1927, and was reared in Hall County. He was a veteran of World War II and was adjutant and treasurer of the Disabled American Veterans post at Winston-Salem. He had also served as junior vice commander of the post.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Katherine John Kandara Weatherly; two daughters, Misses Carol Ann and Patricia Marie Weatherly of the home; his mother, Mrs. Robert Grisham of Memphis; and three brothers, M. O. Weatherly of Hedley, V. O. Grisham of Lubbock, and Pfc. R. L. Grisham with the U. S. Marine Corps in Vietnam.

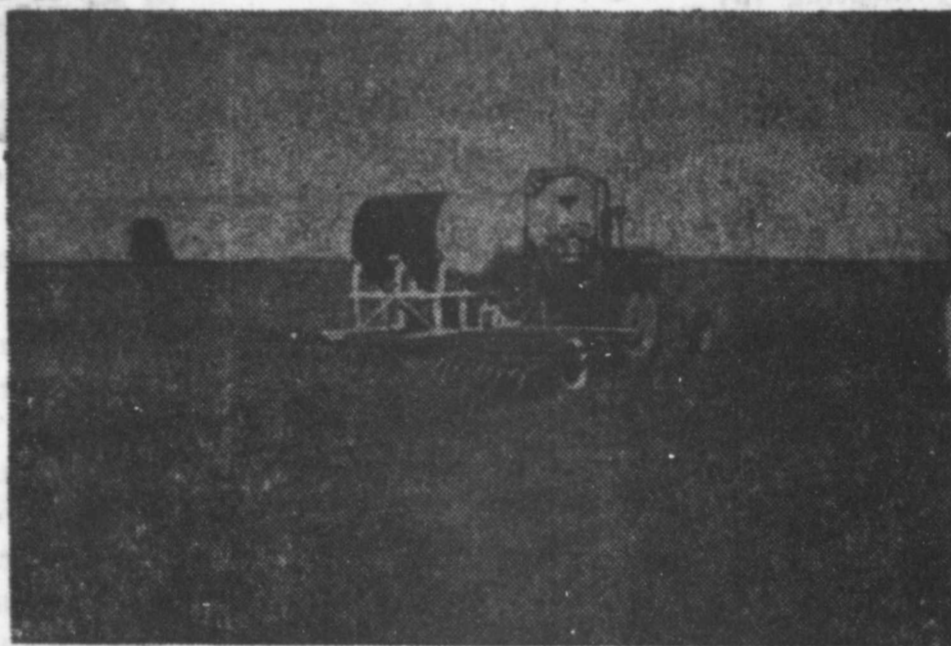
### Vehicle Registration



**Change In 1967 Wheat**  
Any acreage of wheat grazed after May 1 will be considered wheat. This is a change that could affect your cattle grazing program.  
**Substitution**  
The substitution provision is

the same for 1967 as it was for 1966. Wheat may be substituted for feed grains or feed grains for wheat if you sign up in both programs.

**Signup Date Extended**  
The signup date for the 1967 cotton feed grain and wheat annual programs has been extended until March 17. The final date to release extra cotton or to request extra cotton is still March 3.

**Measurement Services**  
The measurement service for wheat is available. The staking service for cotton, feed grain, and diverted acreages is also available. Charges for these services will vary for the individual farms, so if you're interested, come in and talk with us
