Four Die In Tragic Accident

A tragic head-on collision about 12:15 p. m. Saturday four miles east of Whitesboro on Highway 82 claimed the lives of Louis M. Spier, 65, his son, Major Jearl M. Spier of Mineral Wells, and the latter's wife, Frances, all occupants of Major Spier's car. Killed in the other vehicle was Roy Lee Barker III, 18, of Harrison, Ark., a student at Austin College in Sherman. Critically injured was Ronnie Higgins, 21, of Denton, also a student at Austin College.

L. M. Spier was born at Tyler, Oct. 20, 1901. He came to Donley County in 1913 and had lived here most of the time since then.

He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. J. T. Hill of Hedley and Mrs. Wauline Jones of California; three sons, Wendol Spier of Hedley and Herbert and Gene Spier of California; three sisters, Mrs. Ralph Davis of Amarillo, Mrs. Connie Taylor of Hedley and Mrs. Juanita Vaughn of Tinsman, Ark.; and 14 grandchildren.

Major Spier was born in Hedley, and had spent 16 years in the U. S. Army. Besides his brothers and sisters, he is survived by two daughters and a son in Japan.

Mrs. Spier is survived by her parents and other relatives in Alabama.

Funeral services were tentatively set for Wednesday afternoon here, pending the arrival of relatives.



A. S. C. News

Crop Measurements

As you know, Donley County will again use the producer certification method of determining crop acreages for 1967. It is very important that you measure your diverted acres out before you plant your row crop. If your farm is fully allotted and you plant all of your permitted acres to row crops, you may come up short on diverted acres (due to turnrows ditches, etc.) Be sure and allow enough for diverted acres and you shouldn't have any problem.

This office will again assist you in any way we can by planimetering, etc. However, our assistance does not relieve you of the responsibility of the acreages reported.

These provisions do not pertain to soil bank farms. Acreages on these farms will be determined by this office, as in the past.

Release And Reapportionment

The final day to release any cotton which you do not intend to plant has been extended until March 17th. This will also be the last day to request additional cotton acreage from any that may be released.

Signup

Those few of you who have not yet signed up are reminded that participation in the annual programs is not automatic though it is voluntary. You must sign up not later than March 17th to be eligible for program benefits.



