It has been brought to the attention of the Sheriff's Department of Donley County, Texas, that in plowing and cultivating their fields, farmers have been using the county roads to turn their equipment around; thereby making deep cuts in the right of way and injuring the roads to such an extent that they are dangerous to the general public. This must be stopped. Art 784 of Texas Penal Code provides as follows:

Whoever shall wilfully obstruct or injure or cause to be obstructed or injured in any manner whatsoever any public road or highway or any street or alley in any town or city, or any public bridge or causeway, within this State, shall be fined not exceeding two hundred dollars.

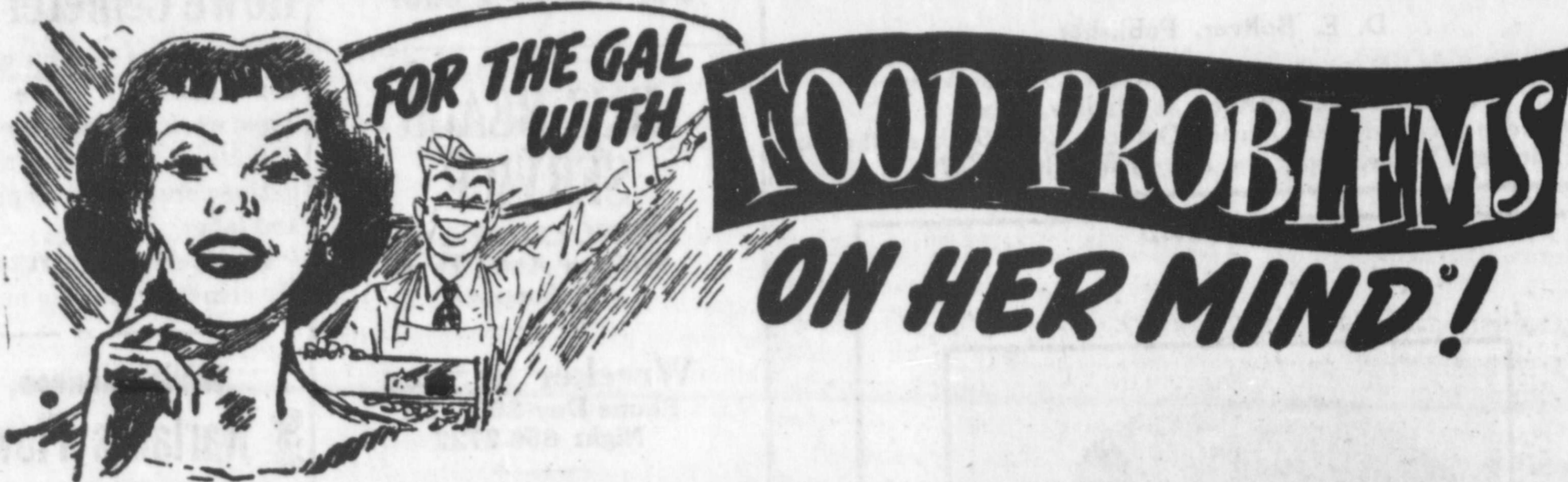
