To Attend State FHA Teachers Conference

Mrs. Sue Shields, homemaking teacher in the Hedley High School, will participate in the State In-service Education Conference for Homemaking Teachers to be held at the Shamrock Hilton Hotel in Houston July 31 to August 4. Emphasis will be given to evaluation of the total homemaking education program. All vocational education programs are to be evaluated in 1968. At the conference the group will have the opportunity to react to the evaluative instrument which will be used in public schools during the coming year.

The first general session will be held in the Regency Room of the Shamrock Hilton at 7:30 p. m. on Monday, July 31. Dr. Donald O. Clifton, University of Nebraska, will be the keynote speaker.

Consultants from the State Department of Education in Austin will include J. W. Edgar, State Commissioner of Education; M. A. Browning, Assistant Commissioner for Vocational Education; Joe B. Neely, Program Development, Evaluation and Coordina-

tion of Vocational Education, and Homemaking Consultants, Margaret Scholl and Mrs. Elizabeth F. Smith, Director, Division of Homemaking Education.

Approximately 2,000 homemaking teachers are expected to attend the meetings. The home economics education program in the state is under the direction of the Division of Homemaking Education, State Department of Education, of which Mrs. Smith is the director. Teachers meet annually for training in new developments and trends in homemaking education.
