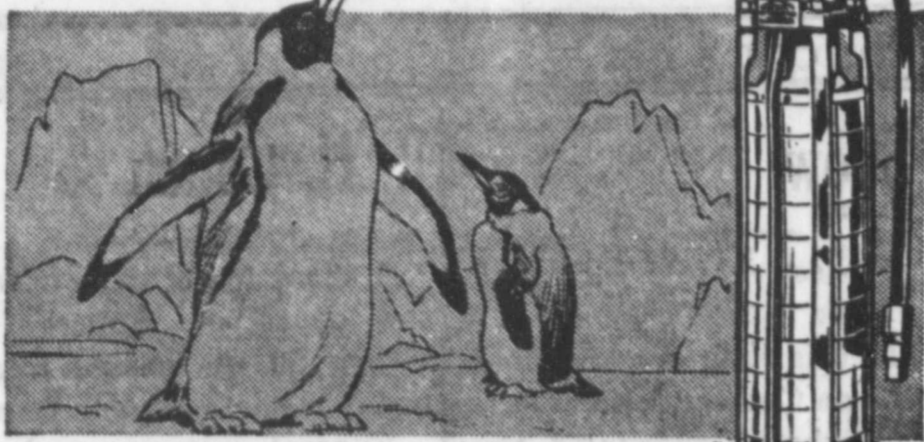

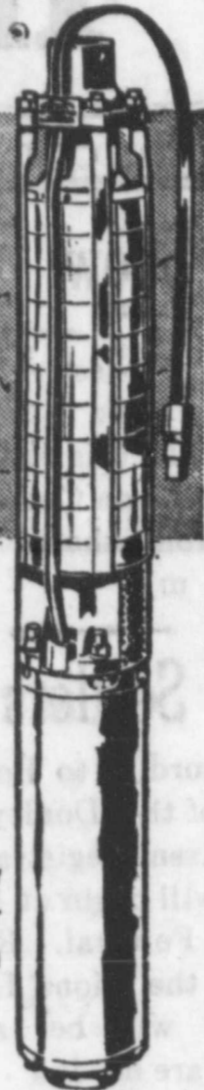

Zone 4 consists of the area south

of the river to highway 287 and from highway 70 east to the county line.

Anyone who owns land in Zone 4 and is 21 years of age is eligible to vote. This includes husband and wife.

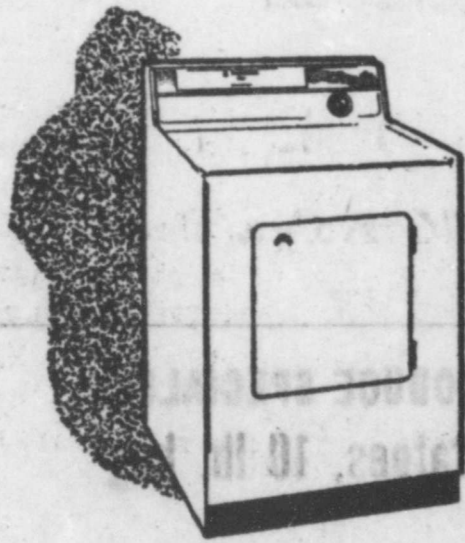
