16th Cotton Festival Is Success; Judy Leggitt Is New Festival Queen

The 16th annual Hedley Cotton Festival was a very nice success, thanks to much hard work by Lion president Doyle Messer and his assistants as well as the girls who sold tickets, also to good cooperation by neighboring towns and the weather.

The climax of the Festival was the crowning of the new Queen, Judy Leggitt, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Leggitt, by Deputy District Governor Milton Morris of Canyon. First runnerup was Pam Myers daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Johnny Myers, and second runnerup was Debbie Stephens, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. O. D. Stephens. The queen contest raised a total of \$1,622.83.

An excellent program had been arranged by Myrtle Reeves, Letha Springer and Mary Ruth White, and Richard Shaw did a fine job as MC. R. M. Saunders, on behalf of the Lions Club, presented a nice gift to each entrant in the queen contest.

Pet Vaccination

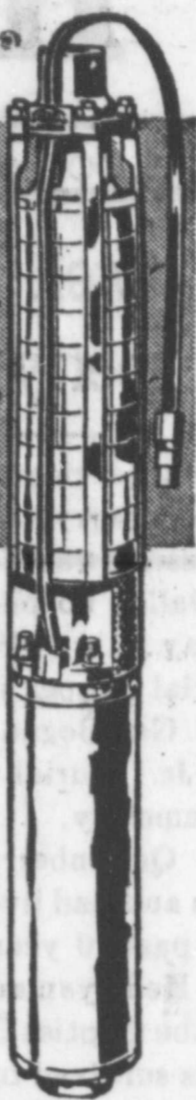
Because of the recent outbreak of rabies in both Donley and Collingsworth Counties, many people are concerned about vaccinating their dogs and cats.
