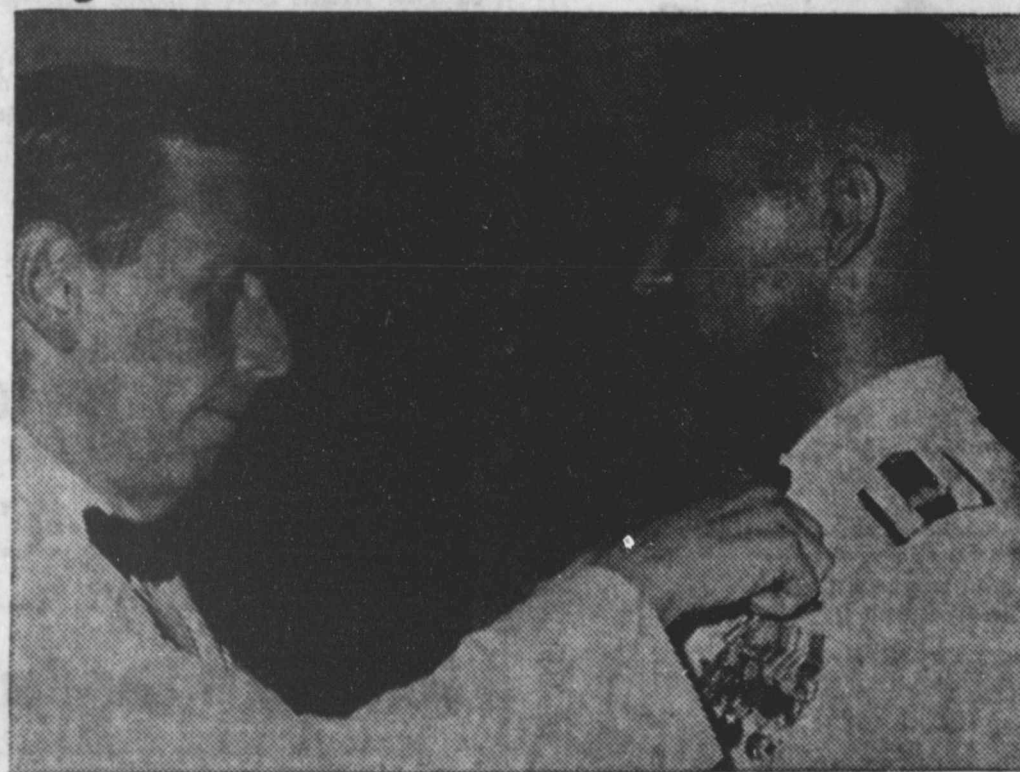
Each class is urged to try to have the most members present for the banquet.

## Hedley Schools Get Good Report

Following the recent visit of an accreditation team to the Hedley schools, a report on their findings has been received, and on the whole it was a quite favorable report.

Mention was made of the new school plant, the well landscaped area in front of the building, the well equipped classroom for special reading classes, school board meeting minutes properly kept, written policies for operation of the school being available to the public, a workable program of guidance services, permanent pupil records, curriculum guides, audio-visual equipment, and it was stated that the basic skills appeared to be well taught and that samples of pupils' work indicated that sequential progress was of acceptable quality.

Only five minor deficiencies were noted. Four of these have been corrected and the fifth is in the process of correction.

The report closed with the recommendation that the Hedley Independent School District be continued as a fully accredited twelve grade school.



## LEGION NEWS

Cotton harvest was accelerated and in most gin communities it was in full swing as dry, warm weather prevailed during the week, according to U S D A's Consumer and Marketing Service, Memphis. Sample receipts ranged from 4,000 to 5,000 per day.

For the week ending Friday, Nov. 17, 9,000 samples were classed by the 5 classing tables in operation reported K. E. Voelkel, in charge of the Memphis classing office. The seasonal total of 22,000 is almost double the amount classed as of the same date last year.

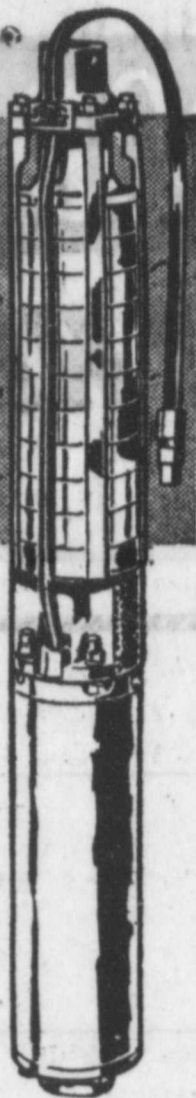
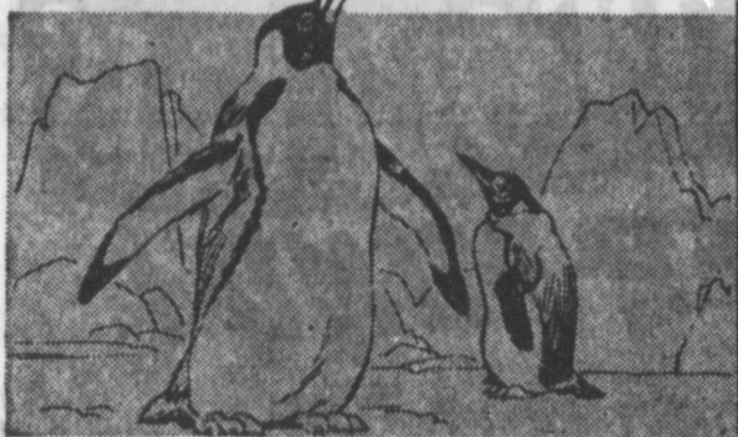
