With high yields, good quality, and top prices, farmers and ginners of the Eastern Panhandle are all smiles according to K. E. Voelkel of the U S D A's cotton classing office in Memphis.

Harvesting and ginning advanced rapidly under ideal weather conditions. Voelkel stated that the 7 classing tables in operation processed a total of 22,000 samples for the week ending Nov. 24. This brought the seasonal total to 44,000 samples compared with 28,000 as of the same date in 1966.


