Basketball News

The second annual Salt Fork Classic Invitational Tournament, co-sponsored by the Clarendon College Athletic Department and the Clarendon Jaycees, will get under way at 9:15 a. m., Thursday, Dec. 14. Eighteen teams are participating, with nine boy's teams and nine girl's teams entered from high schools at Wellington, Hedley, Quail, Memphis, Estelline, Clarendon, Groom, White Deer and Slaton.

First, second, third, and consolation trophies will be awarded to the winning teams and also to the winners of the boy's and girl's free throw contest. An all tournament team will be selected by a panel of judges made up of members of the Jaycees. A tournament queen will be crowned on Saturday evening.

Price of admission for students under twelve years of age will be .25 per session throughout the tournament. Admission charges for students over twelve will be 50 per session throughout the tournament. Adult tickets will sell for .75 per session for the three sessions on Thursday, the one morning session on Friday, and the two day sessions on Saturday. Robert Montgomery Announces For District Attorney

Robert E. Montgomery, Memphis attorney, has announced that he is a candidate for District Attorney for the 100th Judicial District, consisting of Carson, Childress, Collingsworth, Donley and Hall Counties, subject to the action of the Democratic primaries.

Mr. Montgomery, who is 36 years old, graduated from Kermit High School in 1948, Texas Tech in 1951, and Baylor University Law School in 1953. While at Baylor he was president of his mid-law class, president of Phi Alpha Delta legal fraternity and editor of the Baylor Law Review.

Upon graduation from Baylor Law School, Mr. Montgomery received the annual Southwestern Legal Foundation Fellowship for a year's specialized study in federal tax matters at Southern Methodist University. He received his license to practice law in 1953.

Montgomery served as a first lieutenant in the U. S. Air Force in the capacity of assistant staff judge advocate, and was a member of law partnerships in Midland and Tulsa before opening his own office in Memphis. He served as special county judge in both Midland and Swisher Counties. He is secretary of the First Christian Church in Memphis, a member of the Lions Club and is presently serving as City Attorney.

He is married to the former Araminta McGilvray. The Montgomerys have three children, Pam, Debbie and Robert, Jr.

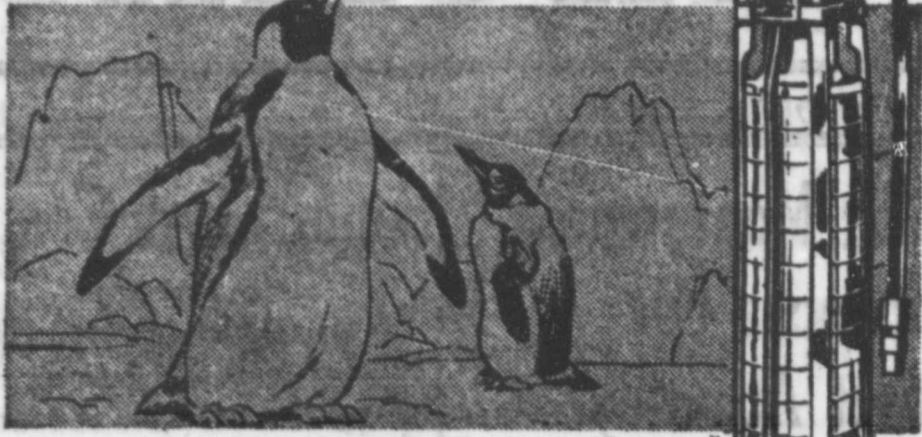

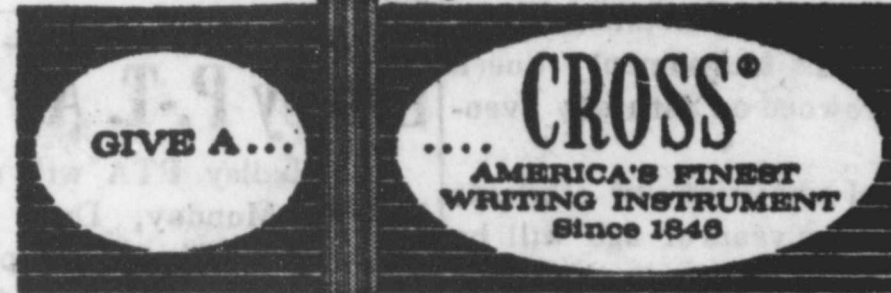

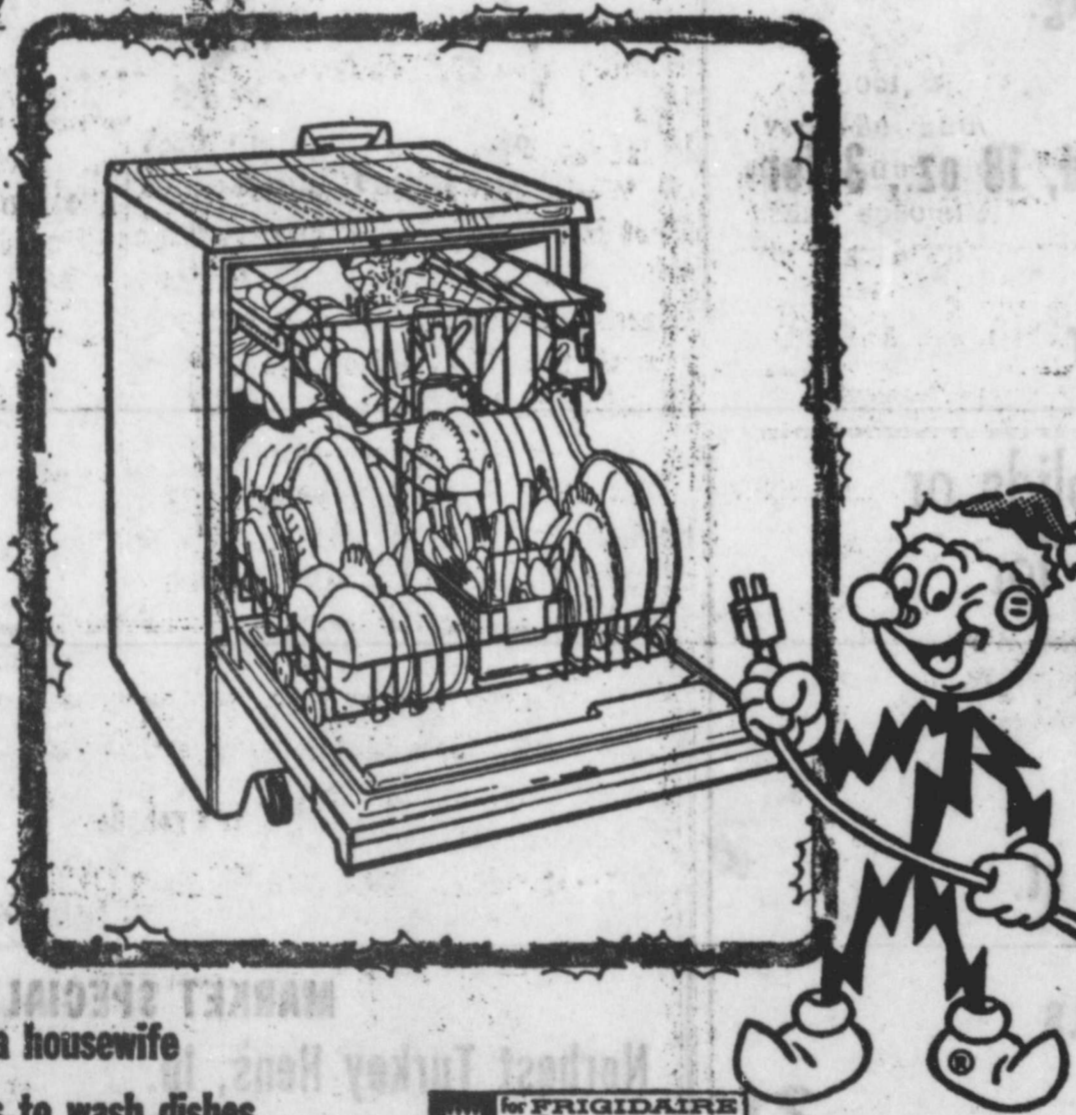
