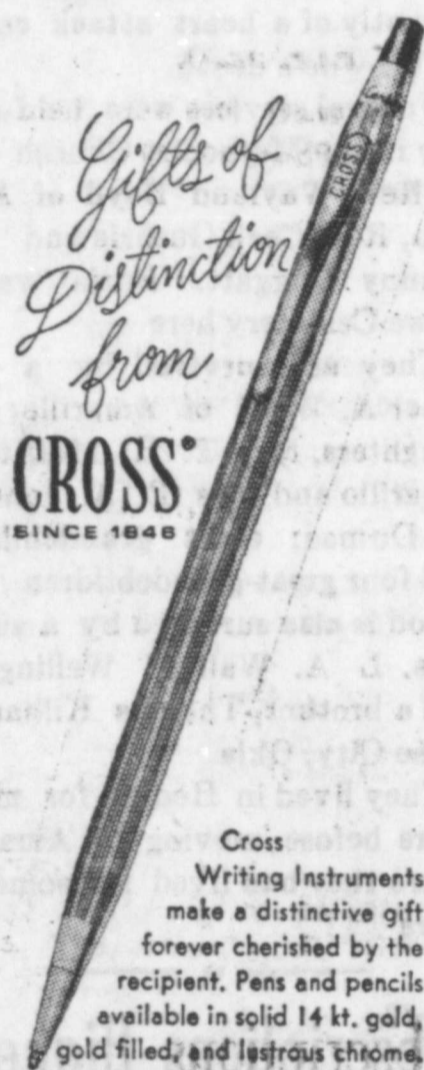

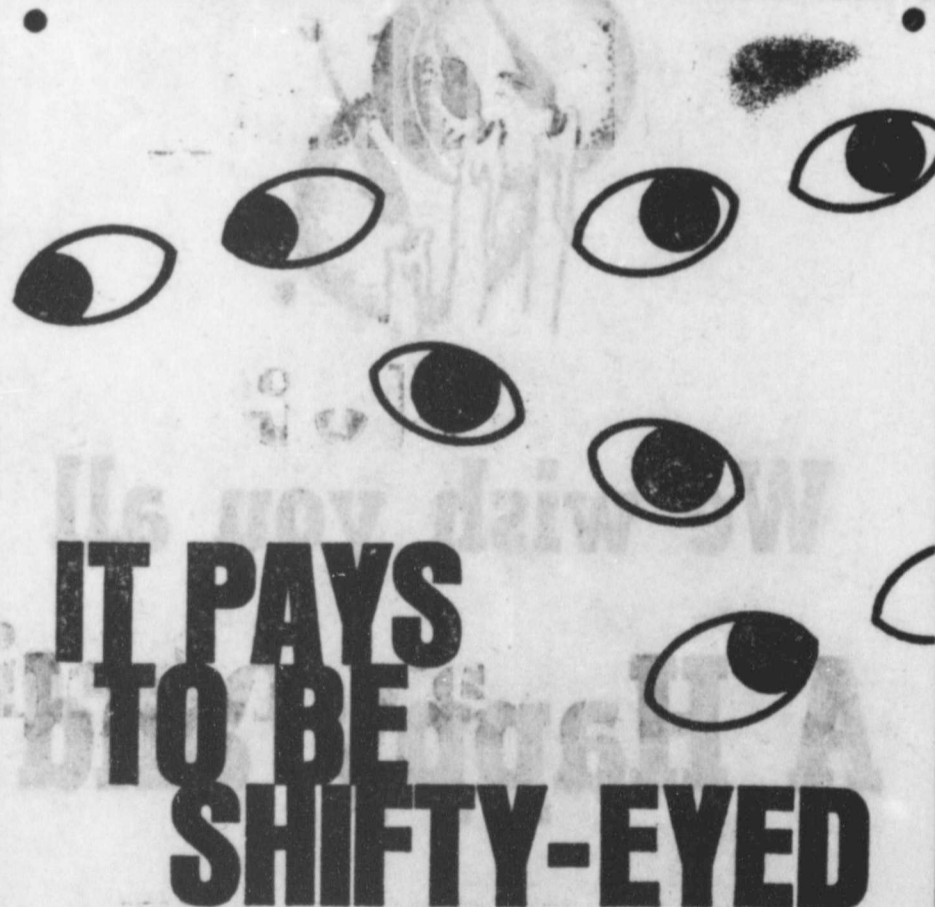

### Greenbelt Dam

The board of directors of the Greenbelt Water Authority met in Childress last week. Clifford Johnson, Hedley director, attended.

Rules and regulations for recreation were drawn up and passed. Fishing, boating and other activities will be allowed soon. Fishing for bass, crappie, channel and blue cat, perch and bream will be permitted. The northern pike will not be allowed to be taken from the lake until they spawn. The pike are now well over 20 inches long.

The directors agreed to furnish the city of Memphis emergency water. Their supply will be cut off until new pipe lines are laid when the construction of the four lane highway from Hedley to Memphis starts. The project is supposed to begin in January. The Authority hopes that Memphis will become a permanent user of Greenbelt water.

The master plan of the lake and lake area, which includes catfish sites, is expected to be ready by the next meeting of the board on Jan 11.

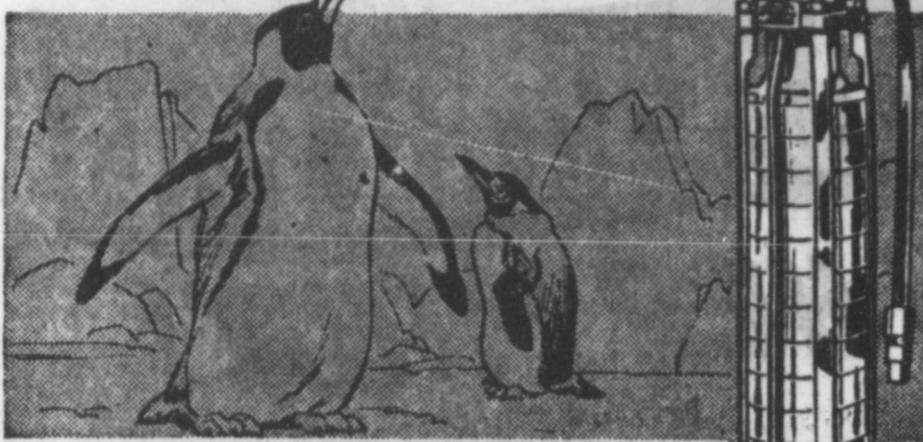
