

This past week the Memphis Office classed 21,518 samples to bring the season total to 150,268. This time last year, this office had classed just over 133,000 samples.

Grades classed this week show 65 percent classed in the Light Spot Grades, and 25 percent classed in the Spot Grades. Tinge grades accounted for 4 percent.


