Provisions of the tax law that apply to farmers and ranchers are explained in everyday language, and examples throughout the booklet show how these rules are applied to actual farming and ranching situations.

Copies of the Farmer's Tax Guide can be picked up at the County Agent's office or call the office at 874-2141 and a copy will be mailed to you, free of charge, Gooch said.

The portion in Donley County is on FM 1932 from Hedley north 5.1 miles, and from FM 1260 east 6 miles.

A contract for 82 miles of hot mix asphaltic pavement and seal coat shoulders in five Texas counties has been awarded to Jago-Public Co. of Denton.

The portion in Donley County includes 16.8 miles on SH 70 from IH 40 to US 287 in Clarendon, and 4.4 miles on SH 70 from 9 miles south of Clarendon to the Hall County line.

The couple will make their home in Aberrathy, where the groom is employed.

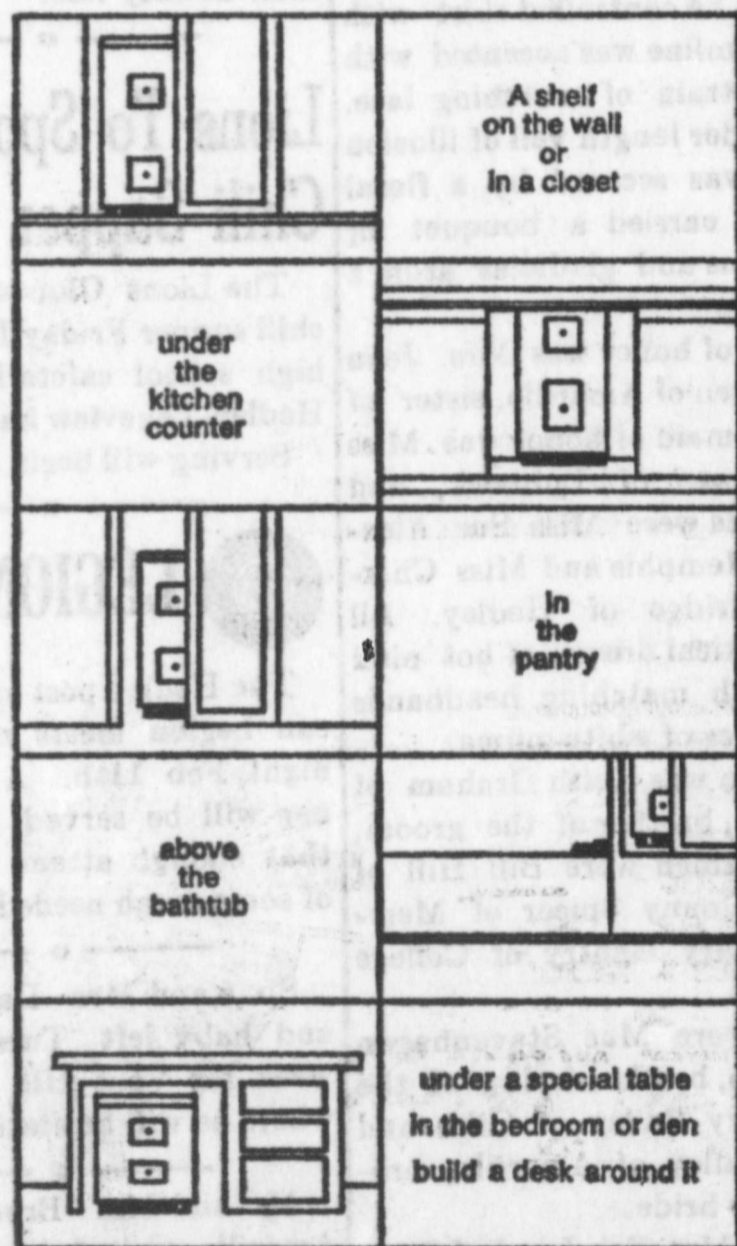

1969 Program Signups

Signup for the 1969 feed grain, wheat, and cotton programs is scheduled to begin Feb. 3, and continue through March 21. The decision as to whether advance payments will be made is expected prior to the beginning of signup.

1969 Wheat

In order to participate in the 1969 wheat program, you must certify compliance with the program and divert an acreage equal to 15 percent of your 1969 allotment. Some producers are confused about this as they think this 15 percent comes off of the original wheat allotment. But remember, you can plant all of your allotment and set aside the 15 percent diversion. This will entitle you to earn certificate payments on 43 percent of your allotment plus an opportunity to divert an additional amount for payment.

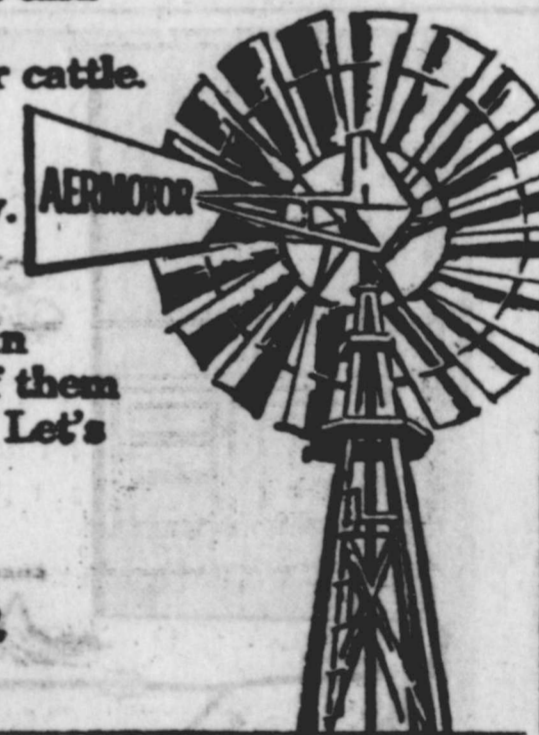

News From Our County Agent

If you are considering the use of fertilizer, then soil tests can be a valuable source of information and a profitable investment says County Agent Ronald Gooch.

A soil test is a chemical laboratory analysis designed to provide an index of the available nutrients in a soil. Common tests are for pH, calcium and magnesium, needed as a basis for liming, but levels of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium are also measured.

Valuable information about profitable fertilization and liming practices can be obtained from soil tests, provided samples tested are carefully collected. Persons desiring more information on soil testing are invited to visit Gooch at his office in Clarendon.
