



News From Our County Agent

If you are considering the use of fertilizer, then soil tests can be a valuable source of information and a profitable investment says County Agent Ronald Gooch.

A soil test is a chemical laboratory analysis designed to provide an index of the available nutrients in a soil. Common tests are for pH, calcium and magnesium, needed as a basis for liming, but levels of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium are also measured

Valuable information about profitable fertilization and liming practices can be obtained from soil tests, provided samples tested are carefully collected Persons desiring more information on soil testing are invited to visit Gooch at his office in Clarendon.
