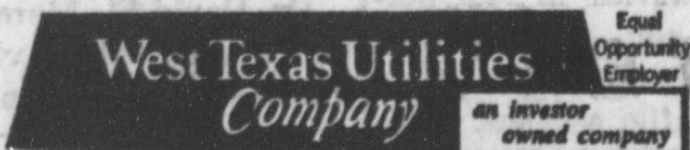

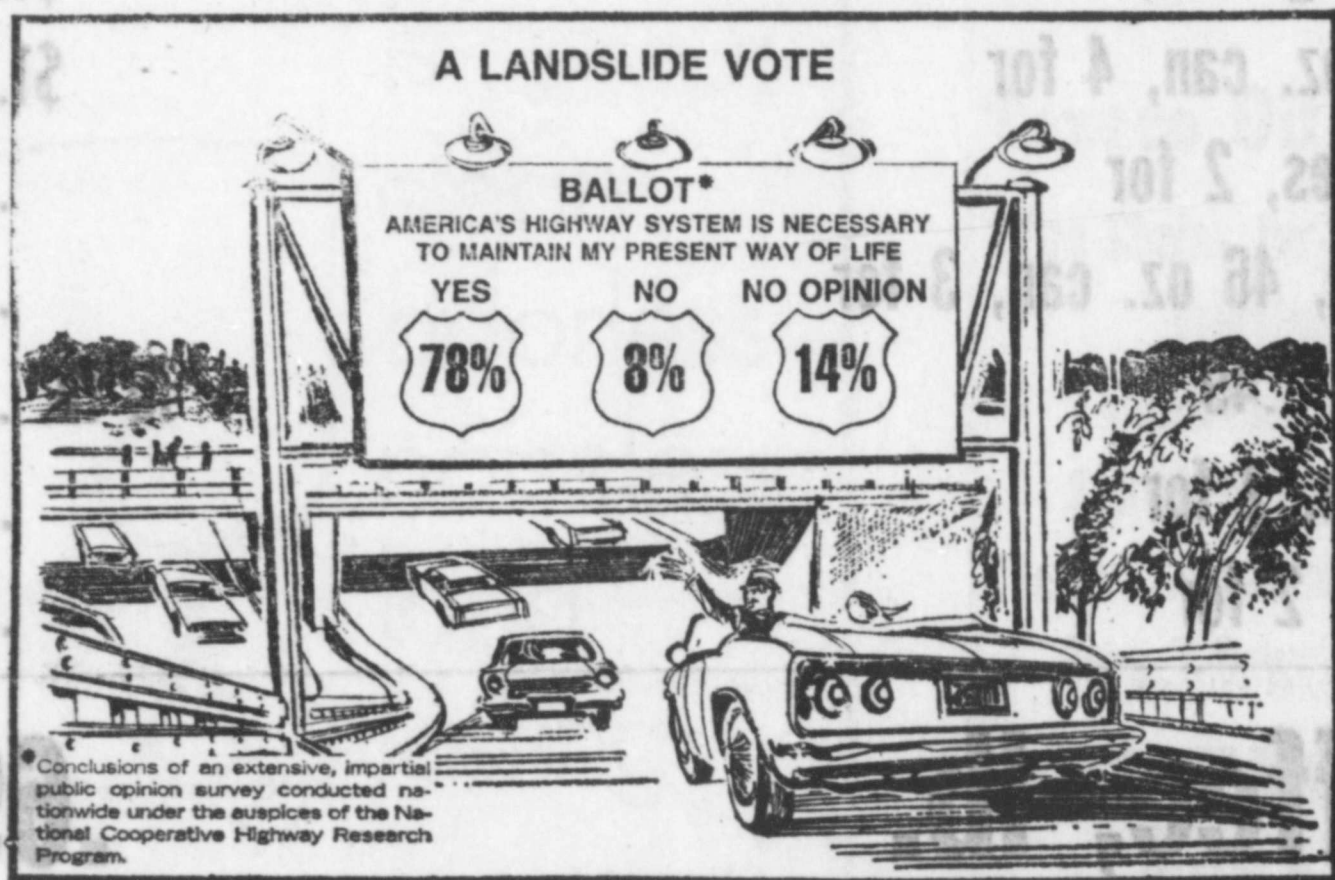

What is thought to be the first sawmill in Texas, horse powered, was built at San Augustine in 1825. Today there are 926 primary and secondary wood processing plants in the state, giving full time employment to 24,000 Texans. Value of goods produced, according to the Texas Forest Service, amounts to \$500 million annually.



**DID YOU KNOW THAT:**



The first capitol building at Austin was partially built from logs and sawn lumber obtained at Houston, in the heart of the Lost Pine area, according to the Texas Forest Service. Today, wood production from the pine-hardwood area furnishes much of the economic life blood of the state.

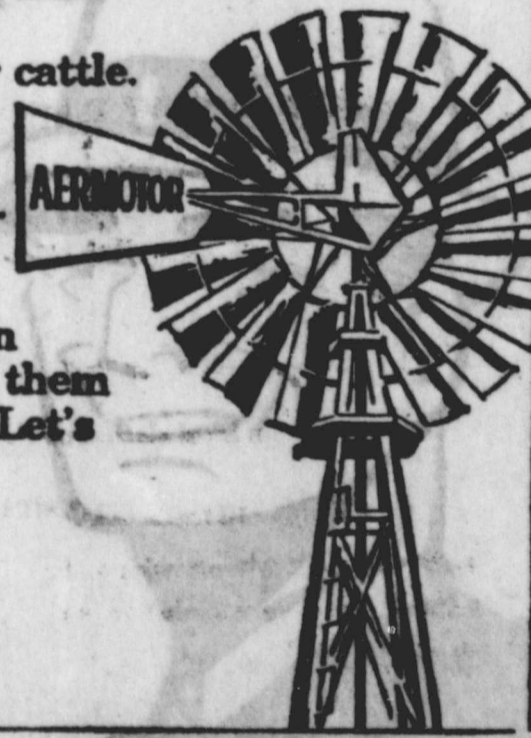
