The minimum will remain at \$6 00 for 2,000 gallons The next 10,000 gallons will cost 50¢ per thousand, the next 10,000 gallons will cost 40¢ per thousand, and all over 22,000 gallons will cost 30¢ per thousand, This is much cheaper than the previous price for wat er over the minimum.






