News From Our County Agent


Greenbug infestations in grain sorghum continue to increase in many fields in Donley County, according to County Agent Ronald Gooch Farmers are encouraged to inspect their fields frequently to detect any damage from the tiny green pests.

The greenbugs are being found mainly on the underside of the lower leaves with some reddening showing as a symptom of damage.

Entomologists give these guidelines for determining the need for treating the greenbugs Treat plants from emergence to about six inches high when greenbugs and damage is visible on the leaf surface Treat plants from about the six-inch height to the pre-boot stage before any entire leaves are killed. Treat plants that are in the pre boot stage and larger when there is a large enough greenbug infestation to cause death to more than the two lower normal-sized leaves.

Additional information on greenbugs and insecticides recommended for controlling them are available at the County Agent's Office






