Lunchroom News

Dear Patrons:

The school lunchroom needs your help, the lunchroom is not desperate but could get that way soon. The rising cost of living is being felt here. The money we take in from lunches and the Federal Reimbursement must pay the expenses in the lunchroom. We are now reimbursed 5¢ per lunch served to the students, but nothing for lunches served to visitors, therefore we are having to raise the price to \$1.00 for visitors to help pay the actual cost of the lunch.

We have applied (under a new law) to get more than the 5¢ reimbursement per student lunch served, it is now possible to receive up to 15¢ per student lunch served, therefore we need every student eating in the lunchroom. We plan to prepare our menus in advance and publish them in the Hedley Informer each week. Students and parents, we invite you to study the menus and see the advantages of eating in the lunchroom. Your participation and cooperation will be appreciated.

It will simplify our bookkeeping if you will pay for the lunches by the month or week. If you pay by check please give the check to the student in the highest grade to give to the bookkeeper and she will make the proper payments for the other students. If you need to charge the lunches for a day, week or month just ask, but please no longer than one month. Extra milk is still 3¢ per carton to the students.

Patrons, this does not mean that we do not want you to eat in the lunchroom, you are most welcome in the lunchroom and school at all times.

New Texas Law Sets "Slow-Pokes" Right

Under a law which went into effect Monday, Sept. 1, vehicles traveling at less than normal speed of traffic on divided highways must be driven in the right-hand lane or as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway, except when passing.

In commenting on the new law, the safety association expresses hope that the traffic measure will be a practical solution to the mounting problem of slow drivers who tie up traffic on heavy traveled roads and are frequently a contributing factor in traffic crashes.

The new law should also ease the tension of drivers who use the high speed inside lanes on divided highways and not only find it mechanically difficult but also emotionally difficult to cope with such drivers, the Safety Association continued.

Many drivers become quite irritated when there is no safe way to pass a slow driver. They often take risks that they would not ordinarily take and wind up in trouble.

Another provision of the new traffic law calls for all moving traffic to stay right of the center line on roadways having four or

more lanes of traffic, except when authorized to go to the left by traffic control devices, or when making left turns into or from an alley, private roads or driveways, regardless of whether there is a double yellow stripe or not.

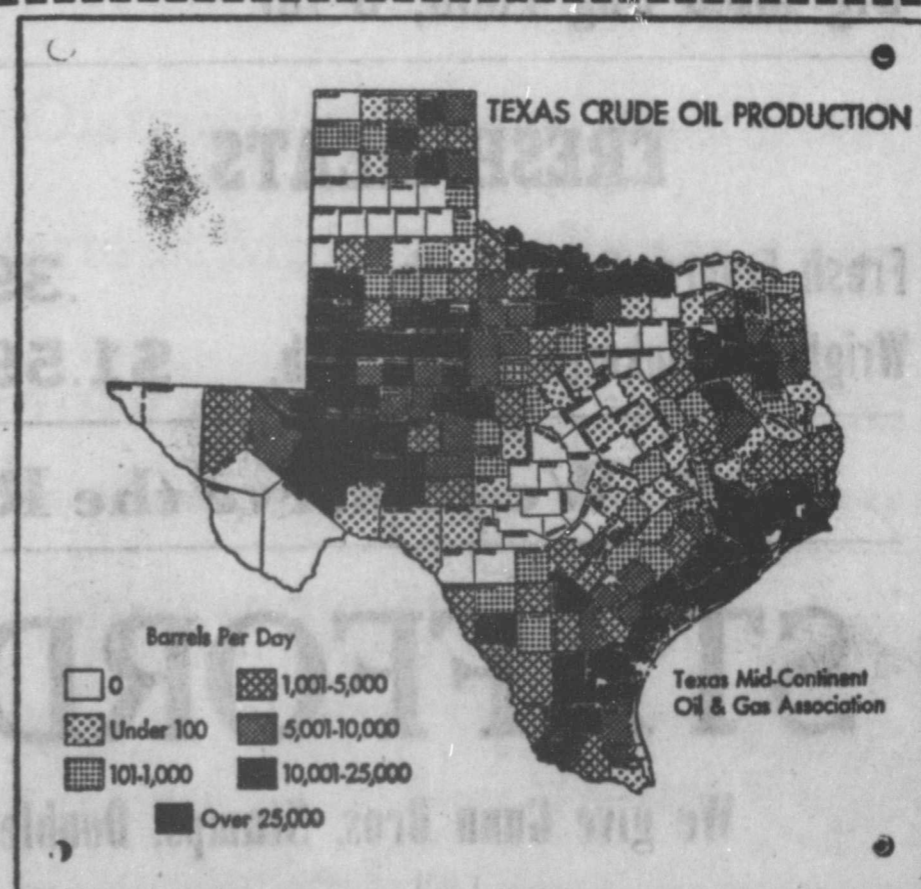
A field representative of the Social Security Administration will be at the courthouse in Clarendon from 9:00 to 12:00 on the following Thursdays:

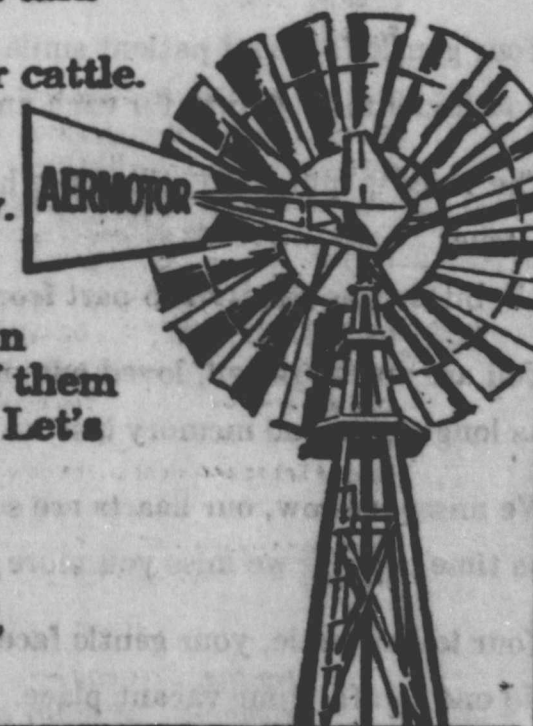
