1919 Study Club Observes Anniversary

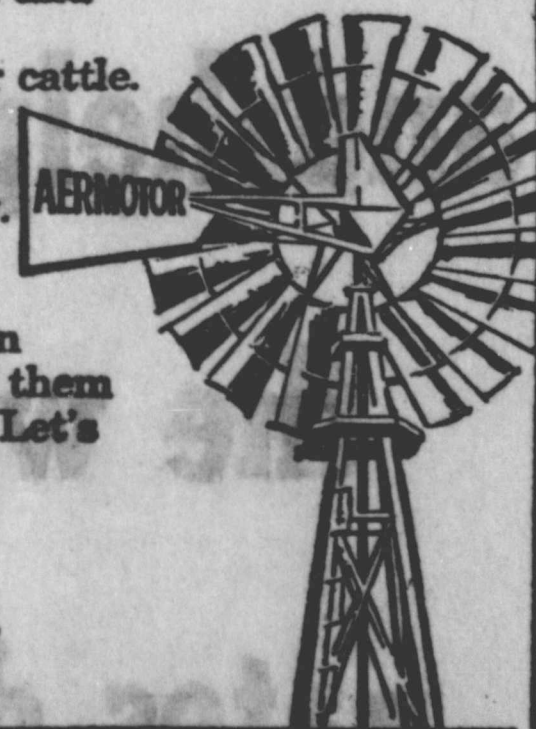
