## Gas Rate Given Slight Increase

The City Council has granted a 6 cent per 1000 cubic ft increase to the City Gas Co., effective at once.

The Texas Railroad Commission recently granted the same increase to Lone Star Gas Co., which supplies the gas to the City Gas Co., and the City Gas Co. has only asked for the amount of increase which was made to them.

The minimum gas rate will remain the same, each 1000 cubic feet over the minimum being increased only 6 cents.

### New Tax Form

If you don't know about the new income tax form, you will shortly after Jan 1. Internal Revenue Service has issued a fact sheet on the new form 1040. Here are some of the facts

The new 1040 not only replaces the card form 1040A, but also the old 1040 form. The new form is a one page basic form to which schedules can be added to cover any tax situation. IRS says that 77 million returns will be filed for this year—1969. An estimated 31 million will use only one page. Another 22 million returns will consist of the new one page form and one additional attachment. Thus, about 75% of all the 1969 income tax returns will require only one or two pages

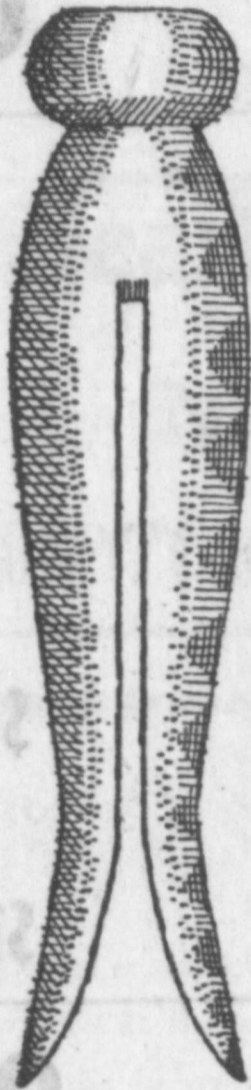

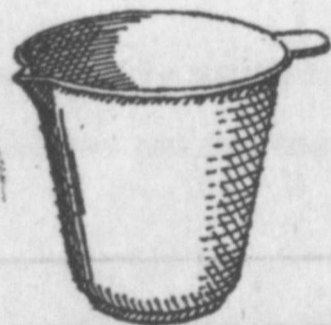

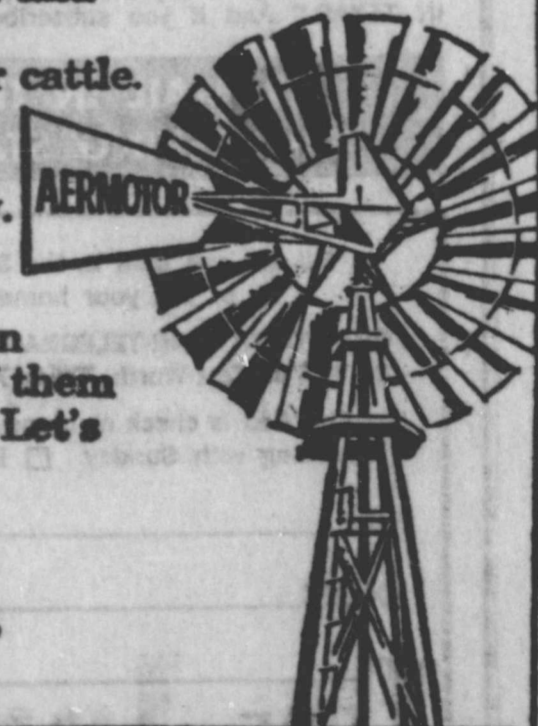
