Accident Report

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated six accidents on rura highways in Donley County during the month of October according to Sergeant Vernon Cawthon, 2:00 p. m Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area

These crashes resulted in no persons killed, four persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$8550.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first ten months of 1969 shows a total of 41 accidents resulting in no persons killed, 29 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$32,936

Vehicle Inspection

Austin-Colonel Wilson E. Speir, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, said today that motor vehicle inspections in Texas are running almost 30% behind last year

"Unless the inspections rate increases, there are going to be some awfully long lines at inspection stations prior to the April 15 deadline," Speir said.

During the year which ended Aug 31, some 6 3 million vehicles were inspected in Texas. Since Sept 1, only 538,000 have received the required inspection.


