New Texas Almanac

Many new features have been combined with traditional information in the 1970-'71 edition of the Texas Almanac published by The Dallas Morning News.

The 704-page publication includes, among other material, the following information not found in previous editions, Walter B. Moore editor, said:

Texas athletic records since World War II

A new map for calculating sunrise and sunset times in Texas.

A summary of major nonpetroleum minerals in Texas

A history of the sheep and goat industry in Texas.

Updated information will include the vote in elections, names of state, county and municipal officials, members of appointive boards, officials of state and regional civic organizations, enrollment in colleges and universities, estimated populations of cities and counties, statistics on employment, payrolls, banking, insurance, public welfare and much other material.

Other features include the complete text of the Texas Constitution, up-to-date maps and historical, agricultural and economic information for 254 counties, and chapters on minerals, agriculture, business, transportation, and other phases of Texas today.

Cotton Referendum

Ballots for voting in the 1970 Upland Cotton Marketing Quota Referendum will be mailed on Friday, Nov. 28. These ballots must be mailed or returned in person no later than Dec. 5 to be counted.

A "Yes" vote by two-thirds or more of the producers voting in the national referendum will mean that marketing quotas, price support payments to cooperators, and other provisions of the cotton program will be in effect for 1970.

A "No" vote by more than one-third of the producers voting in the national referendum will mean:

No marketing quotas and no penalties will apply to the 1970 upland cotton crop. No price-

Wiley Cain, Officer in Charge, reports that the hail and hot drouth of summer, plus insect damage in September took its toll. "Grades are lower and staple lengths are average to slightly lower," said Cain. Micronaire readings are above average at this time.

Vehicle Inspection

Austin -- Colonel Wilson E Speir, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, said today that motor vehicle inspections in Texas are running almost 30% behind the inspection rate at this time last year.

"Unless the inspections rate increases, there are going to be some awfully long lines at inspection stations prior to the April 15 deadline," Speir said.

During the year which ended Aug 31 some 6.3 million vehicles were inspected in Texas. Since Sept 1, only 538,000 have received the required inspection.

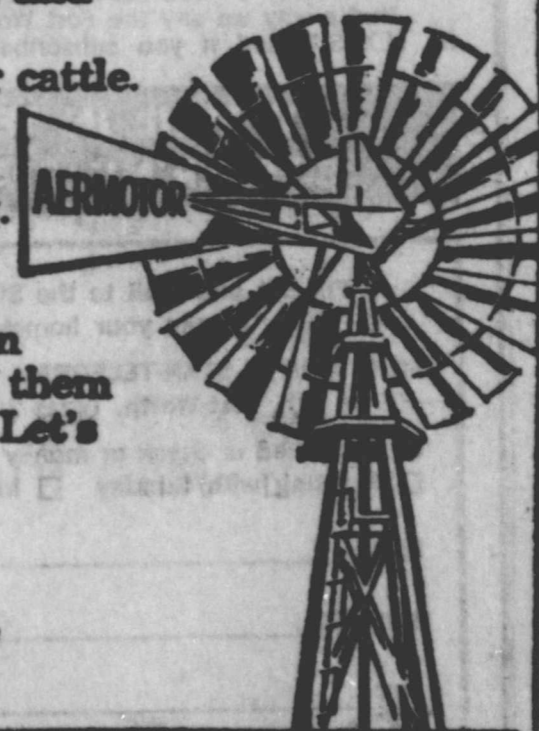
