Public Schools Week On Dropouts

It's time for America to proclaim its greatness, not murmur about its shortcomings. And perhaps Texas will lead the way. The route is through education. In order to put this country, this state back onto the right track, it's time to begin teaching fundamentals again.

For the last 116 years, Texas Public Schools have tried to uphold these principles and characteristics. But, they need your support. They need your encouragement. It starts with a visit to a public school near you March 2 through 6. Let your child see that you care, about him and his school. Let him see what you consider to be the really important values for your life and his.

Let us be responsible for providing the kind of education that will let our children know that they are responsible for the kinds of futures they and their families will enjoy.

The time for silence is over. Too long we have listened to the radicals and those who advocate change-overs to non-responsibility. Speak out—and begin by visiting a public school in your community March 2 through 6.

Keep the future in the minds and hearts of our children. Help support public schools so they can support you.

Hospital Election

An election will be held at the courthouse in Clarendon on Saturday, March 14, to determine if Donley County shall become a county-wide hospital district, and providing for a tax levy of not more than 75¢ per \$100 valuation upon all property situated within the said district subject to hospital district taxation, for all hospital purposes.

At the same time a bond issue of \$590,000 will be voted upon, to be authorized in the event the hospital district is created, for the purpose of the purchase, construction, acquisition, repair or renovation of buildings and improvements and equipping the same for hospital purposes.

Study these propositions and go to the polls and vote your convictions.

There will be only the one voting place in the county.

At last week's Lions Club meeting Allen Estlack read a paper written by Mrs. Estlack on the problem of school dropouts. It was very interesting and informative, but space will not permit us to reproduce it in full.

It pointed out the various reasons for dropouts, and suggested many ideas which had been tried in other schools to combat the problem.

It brought the matter home to Hedley with the statement that our local school had lost 23 students as dropouts in the past four years. Research has shown that a high school dropout will earn \$65,000 less in a lifetime than a graduate will. If we multiply \$65,000 by 23, we find that Hedley has lost \$1,495,000 in earning power.

This is a matter with which everyone needs to be concerned.

In Viet Nam

The 147th Avn Co. "Hillelimbers," commanded by Major Marvin B. Cox Jr., has set an all time high for combat flying time accumulated by a CH-47 Company in Viet Nam. On Feb 6 the company reached the 50,000th hour. This is some 5,000,000 air miles flown by the company, which also has a record of hauling over 339,270,000 pounds of cargo, 478,976 passengers, 2338 medevacs and 816 aircraft recoveries.

The unit was first organized in June, 1965, and went to Viet Nam in November of that year, located at Vung Tau airfield, where it still is.

They have established an enviable record during their years in Viet Nam, and their motto, "No Hill for a Climber, No Mission too Difficult," will ensure their continued success.

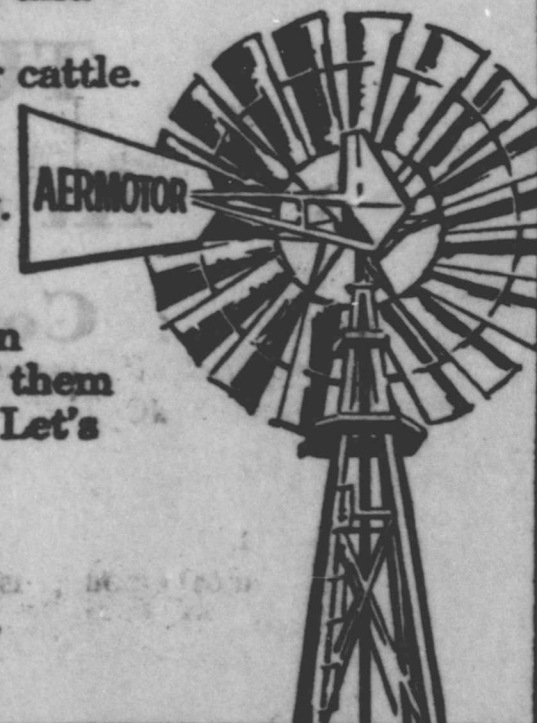
