B. H. Kirkpatrick

Hedley lost another long time resident last Tuesday when Bill Herman Kirkpatrick, 74, passed away in the VA hospital at Amarillo. He had been ill for some time.

Funeral services were held Friday in the First United Methodist Church here by Rev. C. H. Murphy. Burial was in Rowe Cemetery under direction of Spicer Funeral Home.

Mr. Kirkpatrick was born June 2, 1896, in Indian Territory, and came to Hedley with his parents in 1904. He was united in marriage to Miss Myrtle Bell Willis July 19, 1945, at Memphis. He was a veteran of World War I and was a member of the Hedley American Legion post. He operated a service station until he retired in 1962.

He is survived by his wife and two sisters, Miss Ella Kirkpatrick of Hedley and Mrs. M. W. Moore of Anchorage, Alaska.

Rev. Billy Wilson attended funeral services at Roby Thursday for his aunt, Mrs. Janie Morton.

A Letter

The superintendent and school board of both Hedley and Quitaque have received the following letter from Loran Denton, chairman of District 4-B:

Gentlemen:
The Executive Committee of District 4-B Basketball met in Turkey on Wednesday evening, January 27, 1971. Among other items of business there came before the Committee a report involving possible violation of the basketball code during a ball game played in Hedley on January 19.

The incident in question had been reported to me as chairman of the district by both Supt. Freeman of Hedley and Supt. Conner of Quitaque. As chairman I had asked each to prepare a statement of the incident as he saw it. Each superintendent submitted his statement.

It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that the incident was minor and required no harsh punishment of either school; however, the Committee did feel that the Quitaque school should reprimand its coach for his behavior and to suggest that the Superintendent and Board take a good look at the overall situation to determine if there are pressures or conditions in the community that would put the coach under stress or strain that would cause him to act irresponsibly.

The Hedley Superintendent and Board are asked to take a good look at the score-keeping situation and if at all possible to have a responsible adult keeping the scorebook, so the coaches will not have this worry. Every effort should be made in your community to foster peace, harmony, and good will among the schools of our district.

I would like to commend Supt. Freeman and Supt. Conner for the very fine way they have reacted to this problem. I do not anticipate any further problems in this area.

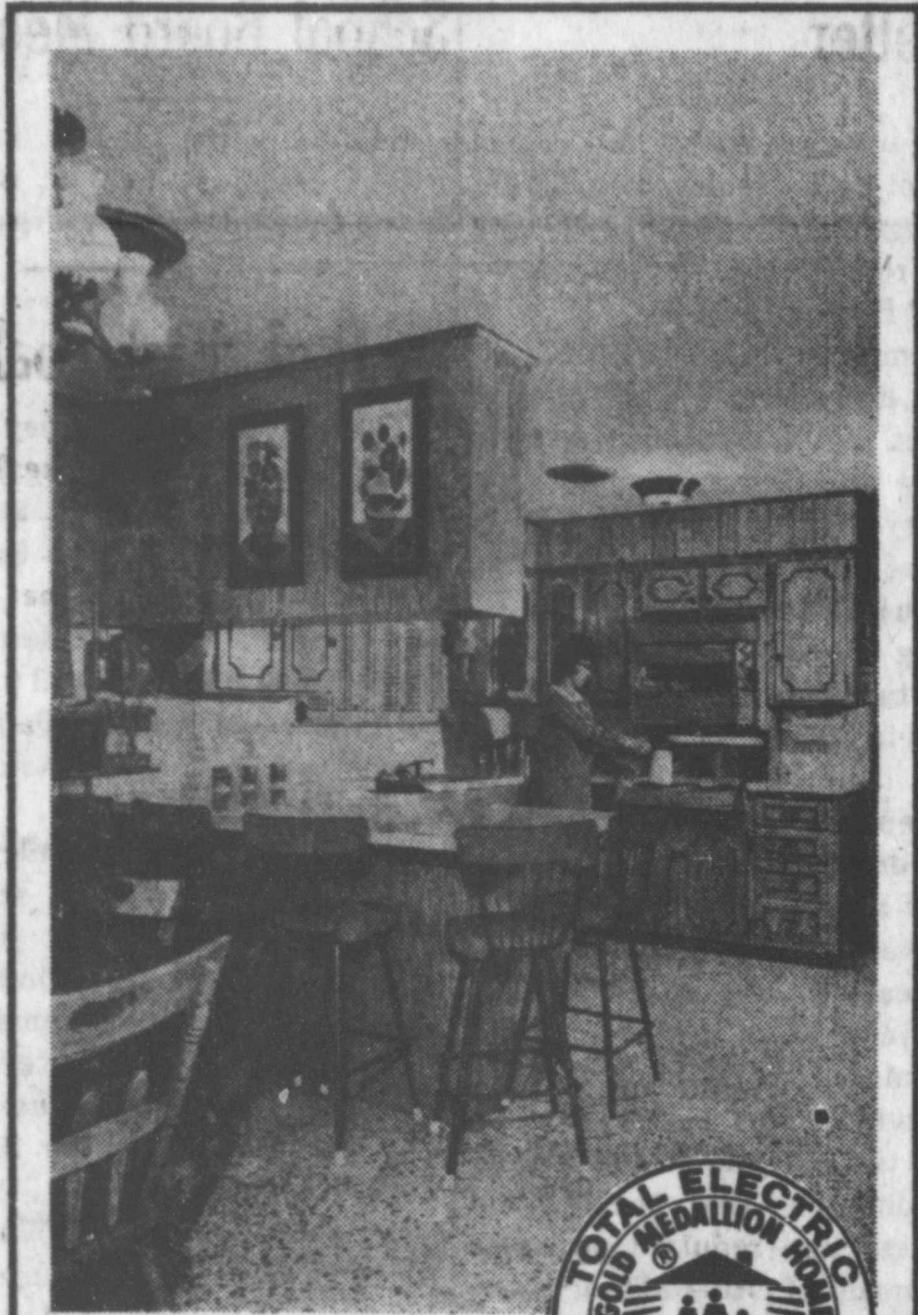

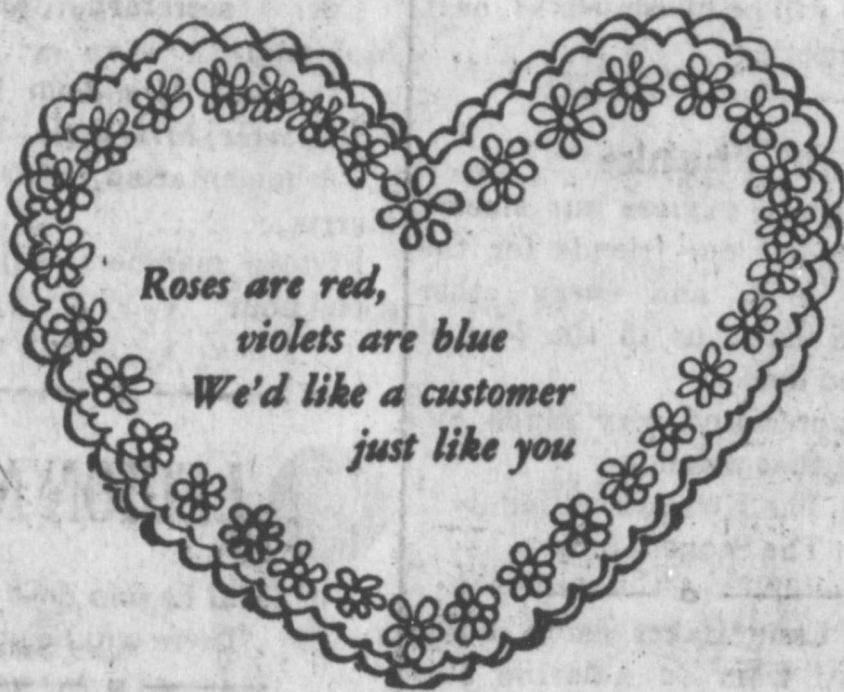
