Thornberrys Expelled From Taiwan

A news release from the United Methodist Information Service of New York advises that Rev and Mrs. Milo Thornberry Jr have been expelled from Taiwan, where Mr Thornberry taught church history at the Taiwan Theological College in Taipei. They were placed under house arrest on March 2 and ordered out of the country within 48 hours. They are now in Hong Kong.

No reason was given for the action, but it was speculated that the expulsion was a political act due to the displeasure of the Chinese Nationalist government over President Nixon's recent State of the World message. Mission Board officials suggested that the Thornberrys were chosen because of their long friendship with many Chinese and Taiwanese people.

Mr and Mrs Thornberry went to Taipei in 1965. Mrs Thornberry, the former Judith Thomas, is from Denison. Mr Thornberry was born in Breckenridge, and has lived in Clarendon, Hedley and Iowa Park. They have two children, Elizabeth Wayne, 4, and Richard Lancaster, 18 months.

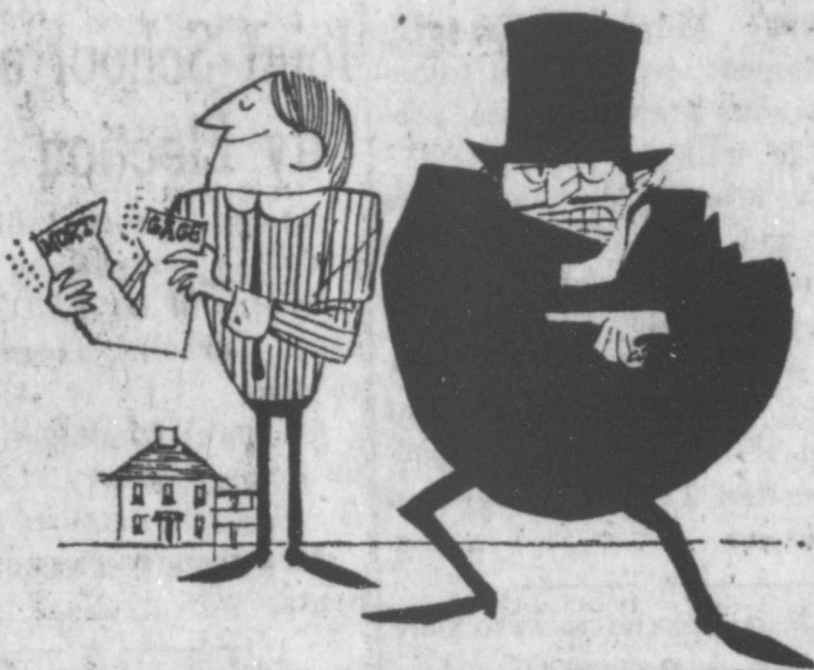
