

Hedley School States Its Free Lunch Policy

Superintendent Garlon Freeman has announced that the Hedley schools will again this year pro vide free, or lunches at a reduced ent's office at the school price to children whose families cannot afford to pay the full price Regular priced school lunches are Elementary 35¢, High School 40¢ school employees 4 ¢ and visitors \$1.00 He said that forms had been made available showing family size and income eligibility requirements,

In deciding if children are eligible for either a ree or reduced price lunch we will a'so take into consideration any unusual circumstances such as prolonged illness, unexpected expenses due to disaster, seasonal unemployment and similar emergency situations

All applications will be rev ewed by Freeman within three days and parents notified promptly as to the decision. Freeman said that if children were found to be eligible to receive reduced pric lucches parents would be notified as to the amount they will be ex pected to pay

Any parent who feels that they cannot pay the amount listed, or whose application is rejected may appeal the decision Freeman said All applications will be bandled privately and information will be kept strictly confidential, he said Children who receive free or reduced lunches will be treated in the same manner as those who pay the full price for the luoches Ev.

ery possible effort will be made to make sure that no one other than the person reviewing the applications knows which children pay and which ones do not pay for their lunches


