Ranch Road 2695 To TSTA Convention Become State 273

The Texas Highway Commission at its regular meeting on Nov. 4 passed Commission Minute No 65441 ordering Ranch to Market Road 2695, which extends from McLean in Gray County southward to its junction with State Highway 203 in Donley County, be marked as State Highway 273. Highway 273 presently extends from Pampa to McLean.

This order was passed in compliance with requests from McLean, Hedley and Pampa, and will become effective upon the date that the 1972 Official Highway Travel Map is released to the public.

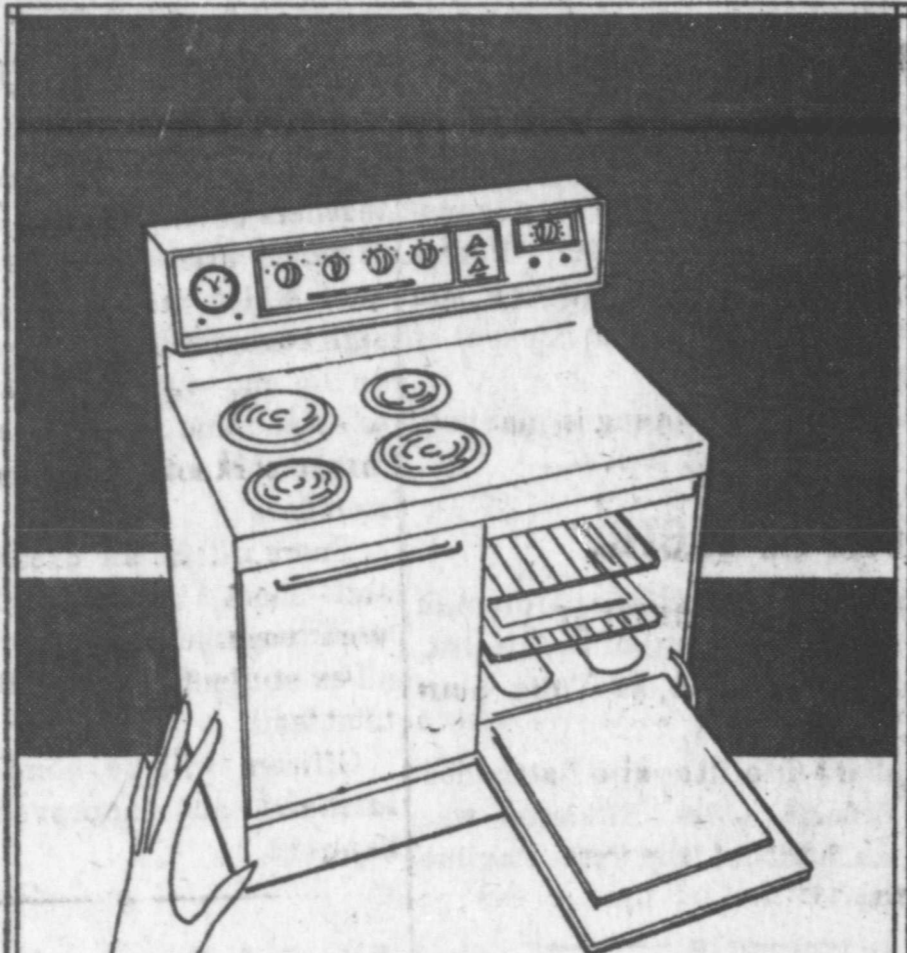
