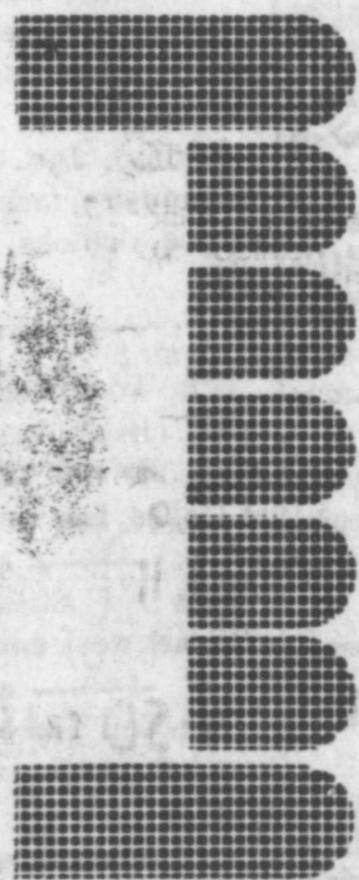

- * Demand for cotton is strong—domestic and foreign.
- * Failure to meet demand could jeopardize markets and the farmer's investment in land, equipment, and other production resources.

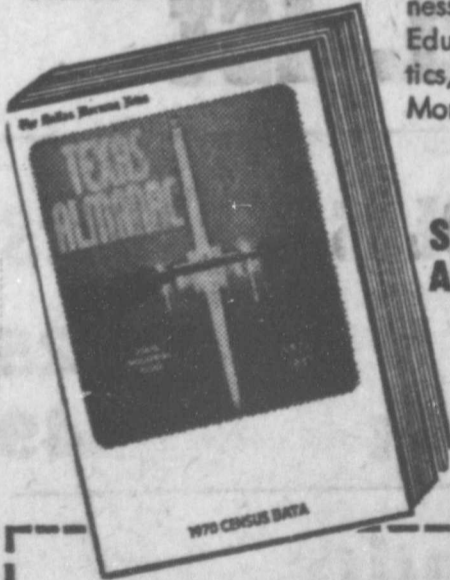

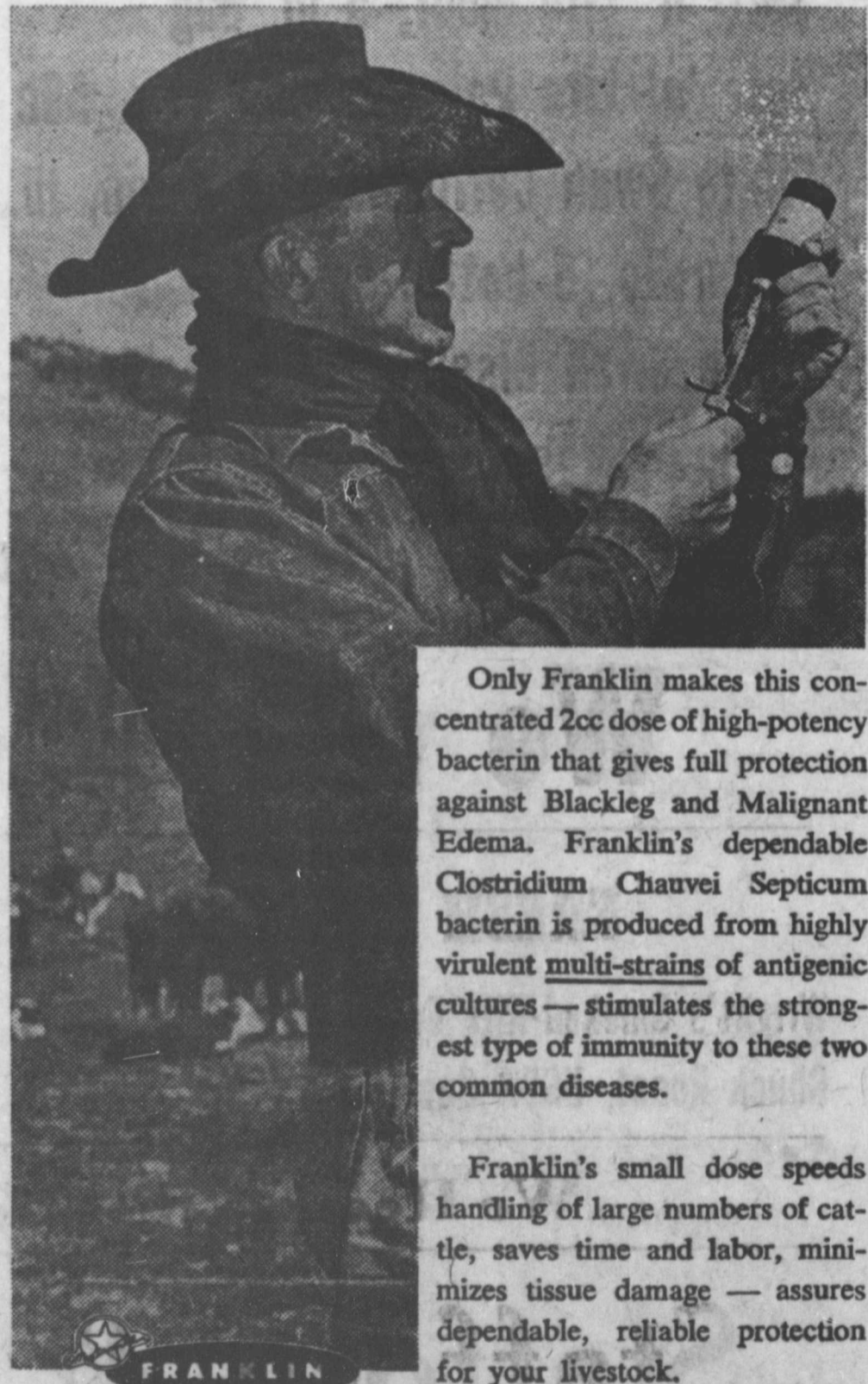

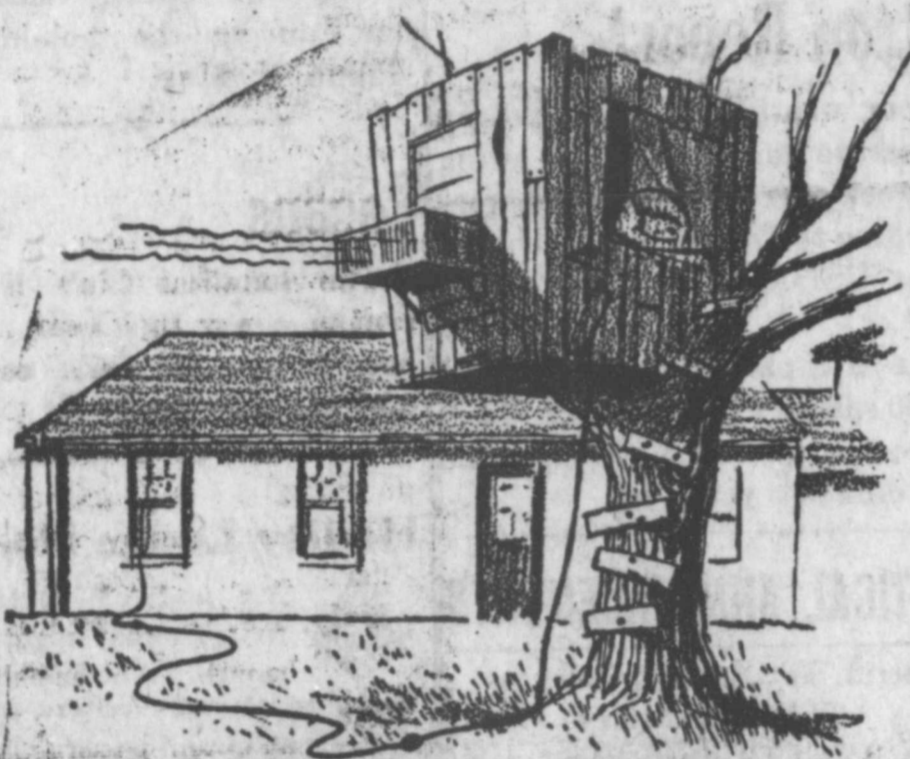
