"Key 73"

The greatest movement of Christian outreach in the history of North America will climax in 1973, leaders of more than 100 denominations have reported.

It is "Key 73" a "continental call to Christ" that is destined to touch every American home, in every city and town, either with action of local churches, Bible distribution or by radio, television and daily and weekly newspapers. Lutheran, Southern Baptist, Assemblies of God, United Methodist, and 99 more churches have embraced this "mass call to Christian witness and involvement."

The overall theme of the program will be implemented in six phases—"Calling Our Continent To Repentance and Prayer-To The Word of God-To The Resurrection-To New Life-To The Proclamation-To Commitment."

"Key 73 is no bureaucratic program" the executive director of the "Key 73" Central Committee, Dr. Theodore Raedeke of St. Louis, Missouri, a Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod churchman said.

Raedeke added: "This massive evangelism program will be focused on local church activities and will not be dominated by any denomination."

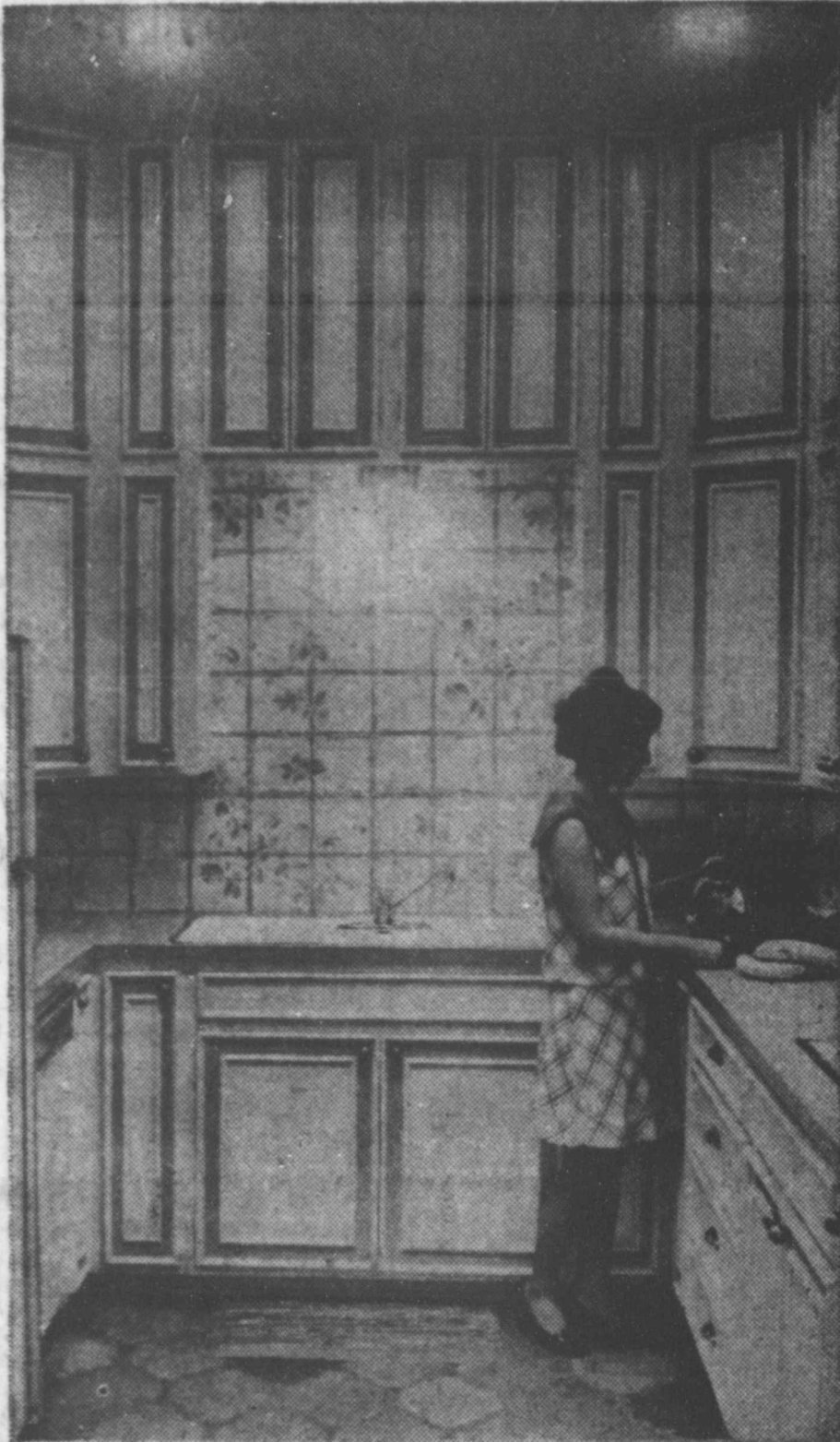

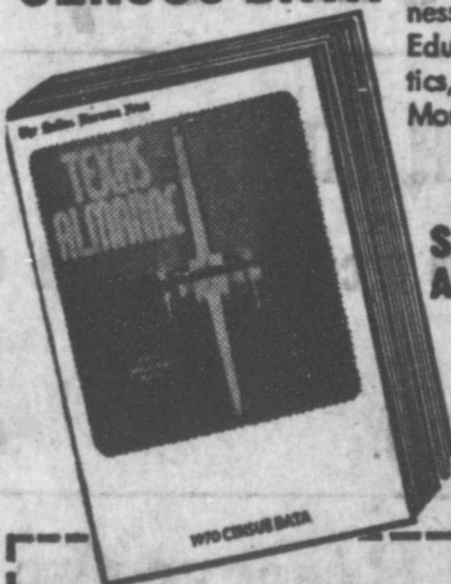

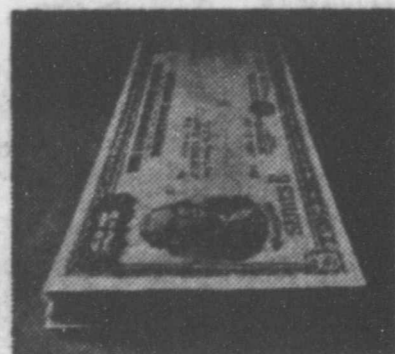
