Cates Announces

State Representative Phil Cates announced today that he has filed for re-election to a third term in the Texas House of Representatives.

The Pampa Democrat announced that he would continue to serve the people of District 66 fairly and honestly. "Both the District and the Capitol Offices are open daily during the week," Rep. Cates said.

"I am seeking a third term to the Texas House and pledge my continued support for (1) the development of a sufficient water supply for the Panhandle-Plains region, (2) frugal fiscal practices at all levels of state government, and (3) making good government subservient to the people, rather than the people being slaves to government red tape," Cates said in his announcement.

Rep. Cates is currently serving as a delegate to the history making Constitutional Convention of 1974. At the Convention, Delegate Cates was appointed to the committee on the executive by Convention President Price Daniel Jr.

Rep. Cates has served as Vice-Chairman of the Human Resources Committee during the past legislative term as well as Vice-Chairman of the sub-committee on water within the Natural Resources Committee. Rep. Cates also has a seat on the Agriculture Committee in the House of Representatives. He was appointed to the special interim committee on state economy by the Speaker of the House.

Rep. Cates has sponsored legislation against persons involved in child abuse, the bill to allow spraying instead of dipping of cattle for scabies protection, and he supports the concept of the right-to-work law.

Rep. Cates is the only graduate of West Texas State University now serving in the State Legislature, although there have been others in the past. Cates served as Assistant Dean of Student Life at WTSU prior to his election to the 62nd Legislature in 1971.

Cates is married to the former Nancy Kay Holt of Pampa and represents ten Texas counties which include Gray, Wheeler, Collingsworth, Floyd, Armstrong, Childress, Briscoe, Hall, Motley and Denley.

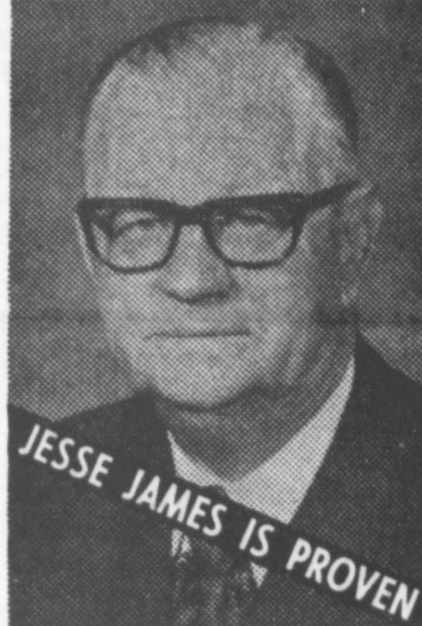
