## State FHA Meeting

"Today's Concern-Tomorrow's Impact! was the theme of the 1974 state meeting of the Texas Association of Future Homemakers of America held at the Convention Center in Dallas, April 25-26. 5,544 members and advisors representing over 69,000 members in 1,800 chapters throughout the state attended. Members are homemaking students in junior and senior high schools. Homemaking teachers serve as advisors.

Representatives of the Hedley chapter were Kay Skaggs, Paula Clendennen, and advisor, Mrs. Mary Freeman. As Hedley chapter member who had earned the most points this year, Kay Skaggs was voting delegate.

The business of the Texas Association was conducted at the House of Delegates session on Thursday evening, followed by a talent show featuring Areas I-V. Fellett chapter's singing and dancing Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy of Company B was presented by eleven of their FHAers. Sandra Earley's singing accompanied by her timble playing got a standing ovation from the audience.

Dallas Cowboy quarterback, Roger Staubach, was keynote speaker. Along with his professional football career, the Heisman Trophy winner has been active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, a member of the Governor's Drug Advisory Council, and was the 1973 State Easter Seal chair-

man. He encouraged members of the audience to grow personally and in relationships with family and friends. He stressed maintaining a positive attitude in situations which we cannot control.

FHAers who have achieved unusual accomplishments by completing all three levels of the Encounter Growth and Development program were honored at a breakfast on Friday morning.

A State Chorus of 100 female and 20 male Future Homemakers chosen by their areas was featured. This group was under the direction of Dr. Wilford B. Crawford, Program Facilitator-Creative Arts, Dallas Independent School District.

Installation of the 1974-75 state officers climaxed the Friday evening session. At this time, eleven officers elected through chapter participation throughout the state were placed in office. A newly elected president received the gavel from Annette Reznik, Friona, outgoing president. One of the new officers is a boy.

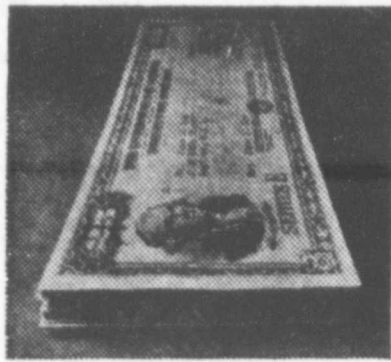
