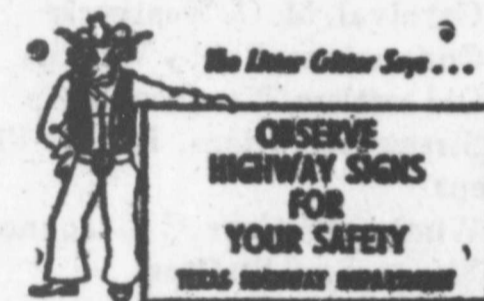

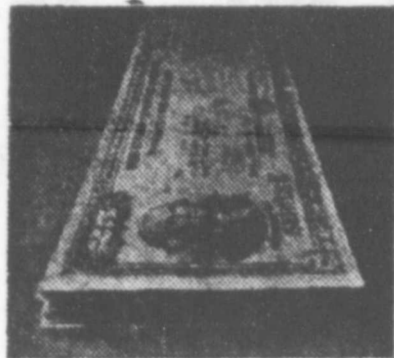

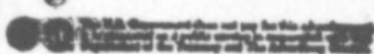

### Concessions

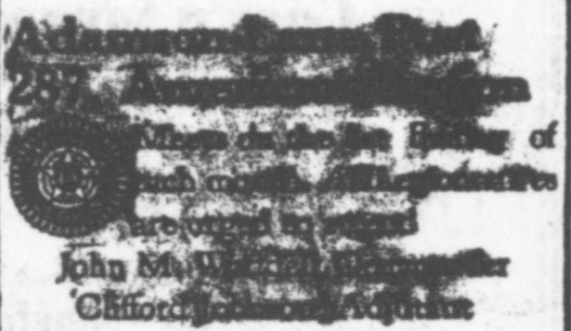
Bobby Wiggins is in charge of the concessions for the Cotton Festival. The Hedley school and other local organizations have preference but they should see him soon.

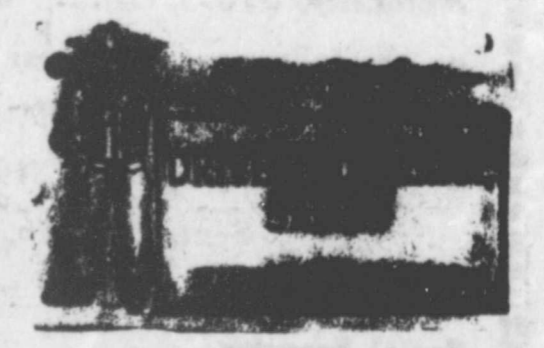
