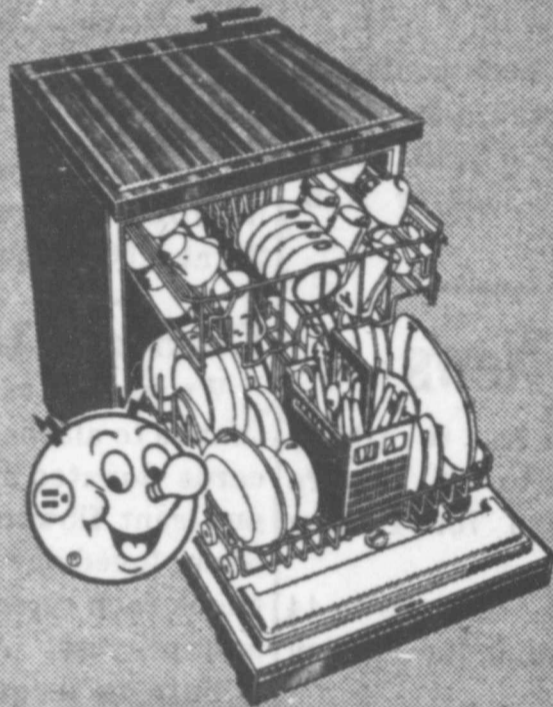

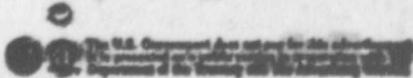

Shirley Crow and daughters Dena and Michelle of Amarillo visited the Jap Shaws and Mrs Lamberson Saturday.

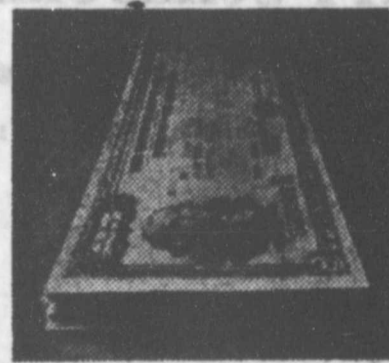
