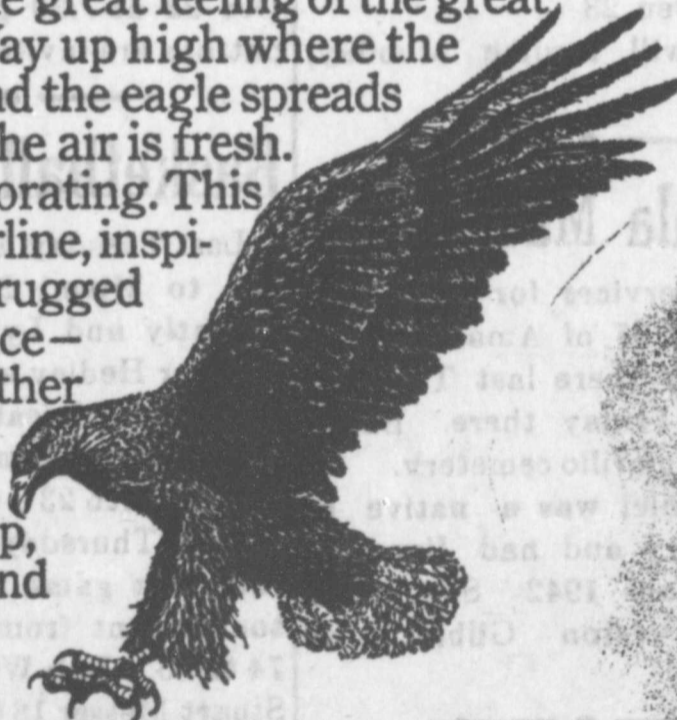

ENGLISH LEATHER TIMBERLINE



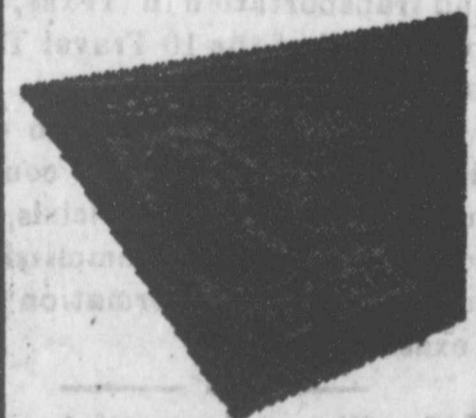

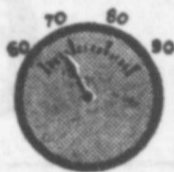

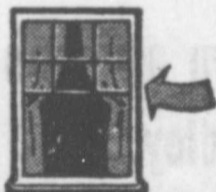

They laughed when I bought my first Bond.

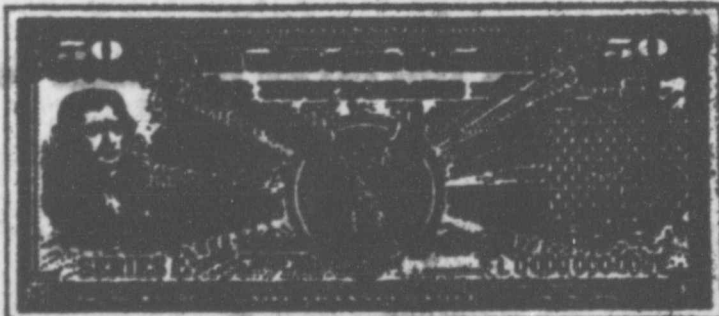
