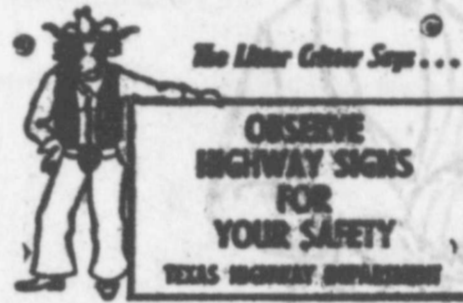
LIONS ROAR
