Richard Finch For County Supt.

Richard Finch has lived in the Donley County area most of his life. He graduated from Lelia Lake High School in 1931. He received his BA degree from Abilene Christian College, where he was a member of the Alpha Chi fraternity.

While in ACC he married Travis Donald of Colorado City, Texas. They have four children: Richard, Edna Beth, Roger and Philip. After Mr. Finch graduated at ACC he did graduate work in the fields of math and education at Texas Tech University. He began teaching in Collingsworth County rural schools in the middle thirties, at Marvell and at Lone Mound from 1934 to 1937. From 1937 to 40 he was grade school principal at the Maple Wilson School (now called Three-Way Schools). Later he was grade school and junior high principal at Lahey School until it consolidated with Welman Schools. He taught at Welman until he accepted an opening in Lelia Lake school as high school principal and later became high school supt. at Lelia Lake. He was with the Lelia Lake school until 1943, at which time he began two years service with the U. S. Navy. After World War II he began his service with the Donley County Soil Conservation District where he worked until 1972.

Mr. Finch owns a farm, but has leased it to his son, Roger, and is now free to do any and all duties associated with the office of County Superintendent. In addition, he states that he is eager to assist Hedley School in accounting and reporting, in transportation and in routing of buses, and any other related duties where his services may be needed. 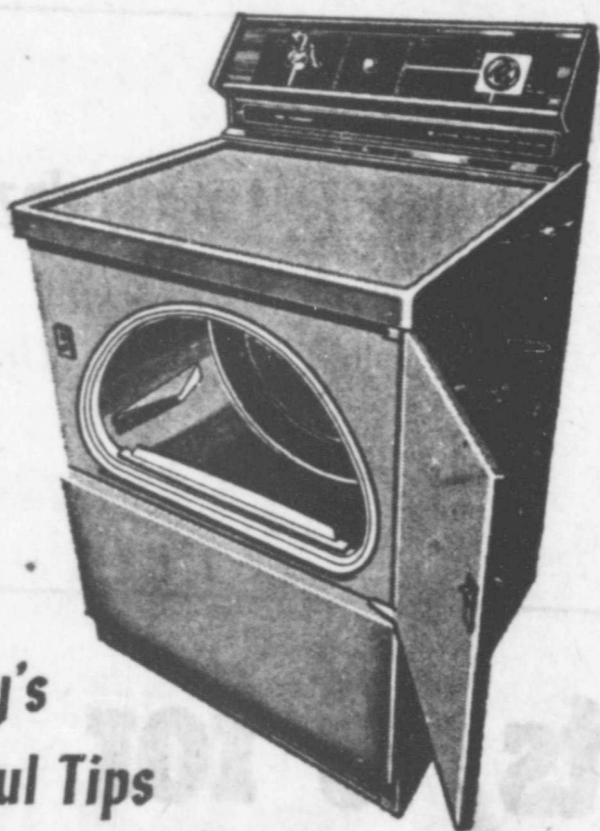
